

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD FEBRUARY 28, 2006.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Velez, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: Councilmember Parsons. (excused)

Commissioner Darlene Love gave the evening's Invocation. Captain John Beerling led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented a video highlighting ShareFest, an opportunity for the citizens of Hawthorne and the South Bay to get together and give back to the community. This year's event is scheduled for March 18th.

Under oral communications, **Margaret Jeppesen**, 11830 S. Gale Ave., reminded everyone that the library will be holding a book and bake sale on April 1, 2006 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Spoke on recently planted trees in her neighborhood that are dying.

CEQA determination: Categorically Exempt.

The Planning Department submitted declaration of publication, which was ordered filed. No written communications.

Mayor Guidi ordered to close the public portion of the hearing. MOTION CARRIED.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING T-MOBILE USA, INC'S UNCLASSIFIED USED PERMIT FOR THE COLLOCATION OF A WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATION FACILITY ON AN EXISTING UNMANNED, MONOPINE, WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITY AT 12100 INGLEWOOD AVENUE (EUCALYPTUS PARK) IN AN URBAN OPEN SPACE (UOS) ZONE.
