

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD MARCH 23, 2004.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Deacon Tom Moske, representing St. Joseph Church, gave the invocation for the evening. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Girl Scout Troop 733.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Merit to Girl Scout Troop 733 for its service to the community as the color guard at the March 23, 2004 Hawthorne City Council meeting.

Mayor Guidi welcomed Pam Fees of El Camino College as the evening's representative from the Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor Guidi presented a short video of the Business to Business Network that was put on by the Economic Development Committee and the City Council.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked Lt. Valdez for taking care of a complaint from a business owner regarding a problem with a homeless camp.

Mayor **Guidi** requested that a walking tour be made from City Hall to 126<sup>th</sup> St. to Hawthorne Blvd. and onto 133<sup>rd</sup> St. in order to check the tree wells and then come back with a report. He also requested a walking tour and report of Hawthorne Blvd. to evaluate why some trees are dying and others are fine.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** announced that there will be a chamber mixer at Cerise Auto next Thursday.

City Clerk **Juarez** received a letter from the Boy Scout organization advising that their affiliates are not eligible to participate in the fireworks sale.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the Hawthorne President's Council will hold their "22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Volunteer Appreciation Day" on April 25<sup>th</sup>.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, the South Bay Leadership Group will host a Prayer Breakfast at the Proud Bird Restaurant.

City Clerk **Juarez** noticed a problem with old furniture dumped on the county side near Inglewood Ave.

Under oral communications, **Michael Genthe**, 949 South Coast Dr., of Trammell Crow spoke on a project involving 450 high end apartments units in the county area of the City near the Los Angeles Municipal Courthouse. **Lee Harrington**, 444 S. Flower St., President of the LA County Economic Development Corporation, requested that the vote be put off on Resolution 6867 so that they can work further with the Council in order to get a sense of the project. **Gary Evans**, 13344 Hawthorne Blvd., on behalf of himself and many businesses in Hawthorne, stated that he opposes grades in windows. **Robert Guszak**, 4450 W. 130<sup>th</sup> St., addressed the problem of no overnight parking signs that were posted near his home in a public parking lot, thereby causing the apartment dwellers in the area to park on his street and making parking for the residents impossible. Requested help in trying to find a solution. **Pat Carey**, 4588 W. 130<sup>th</sup> St., encouraged the Council to promote Hawthorne businesses to other cities, including his flight school located at the Hawthorne Airport.
