

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA, HELD APRIL 12, 2005**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: None.

Reverend Arthur McKibben from the Church of the Nazarene gave the evening's Invocation. Girl Scout Troop # 774 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Merit to Girl Scout Troop #774 for its service to the community as the Color Guard at the April 12, 2005 Hawthorne City Council meeting.

Mayor Guidi presented Certificates of Appreciation to local business owners Bill and Dan Hasaan of KIG Properties, Al Awad of Repossess Auto Sales, Steve Boudar of Gateway Auto Center, Moses Awad of Finance Auto Sales and Mohamad Pournamdari of Pournamdari Inc. for their generous donations that will enable local Girl Scout Troop #774 to make a once in a lifetime trip to visit their sister scouts in New York City.

Mayor Guidi welcomed Don Harris as the representative from the Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor Guidi announced the names of the organizations that will have fireworks booths this year. They are Del Aire Assembly of God Church, Women's Club of Hawthorne, Hawthorne Rotary Club, Victory in Christ Ministry, Southern California Gunners Youth Soccer Club, Stroke Association of Southern California, BHS and South Bay Celebration Assembly of God Church.

Councilmember Velez presented footage of a theft in progress at a local car dealership in the hopes that someone watching can identify the suspect. There is a \$1000 reward offered by the business owner for information leading to the arrest or conviction of the suspect.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that the committee of the LAX Round Table, of which he is a member, has been successful in getting some of the airlines to basically not take off to the east late at night or to change equipment where they can take off over water at night. They have also endorsed a study that would justify to the FAA to ban the eastern takeoffs when everybody is going to the west.

Councilmember **Parsons** attended the Holly Park homeowners meeting and announced that they will have a voter registration drive coming up.

Councilmember **Parsons** asked that staff look at the animal ordinances from the City of Chino as their policy on barking dogs is more aggressive.

Councilmember **Parsons** thanked the Friends of the Library for the book sale held on Saturday.

Councilmember **Catano** thanked Jan Vogel for inviting him to be part of his business breakfast in conjunction with youth employment.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the grand opening of Metwest, a commercial lender that will be lending money to small businesses that want to get started.

Councilmember **Lambert** attended the Holly Park meeting.

Councilmember **Lambert** attended a two-day session for ICRMA on which she represents the city for insurance and risk management.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that we are going to have a Marshalls in town later this summer.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that the volunteers for Al Richard's panel on illegal fireworks is now complete.

Councilmember **Velez** announced that the Hawthorne Education Foundation Golf Tournament will be held on Monday at Chester Washington on Western and El Segundo. Anyone who wants to participate is still welcome.

Councilmember **Velez** stated that the Leslie Zepeda community renovation program going on at 116th Gale and Eucalyptus has greatly improved the area.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that there is a new restaurant opening on Thursday across the street from the Ayres Hotel. It is Qdoba Mexican Grill.

Councilmember **Velez** announced that the renovations at Jefferson Elementary School are now complete and there will be a grand opening dedication on Thursday the 14th at 4:30 pm.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that employees Harold Roth, Hamid Pournamdari and Sergeant Gary Tomatani received awards from the HUD Attorney General's office in recognition for their work on reducing fraud in the Rental Assistance Housing Program.

Mayor **Guidi** related that ice cream truck vendors are selling items to children that look like guns. He wants an ordinance enforced that states ice cream vendors can only sell food related products.

Mayor **Guidi** commented on the success of the South Bay Work Investment Job Fair for graduating high school students and suggested one be held for graduating college students.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that Lowe's on 120th and Crenshaw is hiring.

Mayor **Guidi** encouraged the public to attend a Junior Lakers game at the Betty Ainsworth Center, as it is a fantastic program.

Mayor **Guidi** announced the 7th Annual Children's Safety Awareness Fair will be held on Saturday, May 14th from 10:30 am to 4:00 pm.

Mayor **Guidi**, after several phone calls, was able to make contact with the FAA to get authorization for putting up gates at night at the entrance of the Lowe's parking lot in order to prevent criminal activity on the premises.

Mayor **Guidi** called on Captain Beerling to give an update on programs run by the Police Department.

Captain Beerling spoke on the new park patrol program that operates seven days a week on a part-time basis. Officers come in on their own time and put in six-hour shifts in city parks. The program started in January and so far there have been 70 arrests and 130 citations issued. There is also a program being instituted to deal with gang activity.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked the Friends of the Library.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked everyone who was involved in the new street light installations and everyone who attended the ribbon cutting ceremony.

City Clerk **Juarez** congratulated Mr. Jan Vogel, Executive Director for the SBWIB for his "Let's Talk Business" networking seminar.

City Clerk **Juarez** attended the Hollypark Homeowners Association meeting where he made a presentation on voting trends.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the 23rd Annual Volunteer Appreciation Day will be held on April 24th.

City Clerk **Juarez** thanked everyone who supported the Hawthorne Parks and Recreation Foundation Golf Tournament.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the Wiseburn Education Foundation will be having their 2nd Annual "Rock Around the Block" on Saturday, April 30, 2005.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that there will be a Household Hazardous Waste and Ewaste roundup on April 30th from 9 to 3 at the Betty Ainsworth Center.

City Clerk **Juarez** wished Al Richards a speedy recovery and sent his condolences to the Nibels on the loss of their son.

Mayor **Guidi** lost his aunt in Italy on Easter Sunday this year and also asked for prayers to go out to newly elected assemblyman Mike Gordon, who is fighting a brain tumor.

Under oral communications **Paul Lowe**, 11613 Haas Ave., thanked the council for the improvements that have been made in his area. **Darlene Love** thanked the council for all the cards and love she received during her recent illness. **Thomas Mallen**, 6726 W. 85th Pl., brought to council's attention that there is a property across from his at 3918 W. 117th where the owner has put in a retaining wall around the property that is six feet in height without obtaining a permit. **Gordon Michael Mego**, 4535 W. 141st St., thanked those who attended the services and expressed sympathy on the passing of his parents. He also made a donation of photographs to the Hawthorne Museum. **James Taylor**, 11723 Atkinson, thanked the council for participating in their homeowner association meeting last Tuesday. Stated that there is a problem on 115th due to street sweeping and trash pickup scheduled for the same day. Inquired on the status of acquiring soundproofing funds. Asked if the city could use its influence with local politicians to keep Middle College High School, which serves the Hollypark area, from closing in June. **Kyle Orleman** thanked the council for getting Rosecrans and Isis opened. Asked if there is a way to bury the power lines on the homes that are at the extreme south end of Hollyglen where the new sound wall is going to go through. Concerned that one of the local auto dealerships has a crane on the property with a car dangling from the crane. Stated that there is still a problem at the closed bike path.

Dennis Ciocca of Sutter Securities provided background information related to the Community Facilities District and discussed contents of the Community Facilities District Report.

Under oral comments, no one indicated a desire to be heard.
