

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD MAY 24, 2005**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:04 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: None.

Deacon Tom Moske of St. Joseph's gave the evening's invocation. Al Richards led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A presentation was made by Civica Software to show what they do for different cities throughout California in regards to maintaining websites.

Mayor Guidi recessed the City Council meeting to conduct a closed session Pursuant to Government Code Section 54957 – Public Employee Performance Evaluation. Title: City Manager.

Councilmember **Parsons** walked and completed the Hawthorne Community 5K Walk and Run.

Councilmember **Parsons** attended the Bodger Park Homeowner's Association meeting.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that an ordinance will be voted on that will crack down on illegal fireworks and limit the hours that you can use safe and sane fireworks.

Councilmember **Velez** attended all previously mentioned events.

Councilmember **Velez** expressed concern regarding tour buses that are visiting the Beach Boys monument. Asked for a way to allow the tour buses through, but at the same time not hinder the neighborhood.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked staff and council for the great reviews that they received at the International Convention of Shopping Centers. The only complaint was that property is too expensive to buy in Hawthorne.

City Clerk **Juarez** attended various events in the city and recognized the Public Works, Cable TV and Police Departments for making these events happen and keeping them safe for all to attend.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that soccer sign-ups for the new season will be held on June 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> at Dana cafeteria.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** attended various events in the city and thanked the Mayor and staff for making these events bigger and better.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked Rosalinda Martinez for putting together the Home Depot event and for her work with youth and other projects outside the city.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked Monica McClanahan for her recent work with Calvary Chapel South Bay.

Under oral communications, **Allen Richards** asked the council to consider reducing the number of groups that sell fireworks from ten to eight due to limited funds that were received by the groups after the fireworks were sold. **DeKai Amonrasi** would like Eucalyptus Park be a permanent solid surface so senior citizens could have a flatter space to walk. Stated that the turn signal at Imperial and Hawthorne is hard to see when making a left turn. **Frances Stiglich** thanked the public works department for the nice work they did on Gale Ave. but stated that there is a problem with beer parties at the parking lot.

A1, that's kind of redundant because number five gives you the same information for the first 18 inches, so we don't need it listed twice. And the community already did approve five feet see through fence in their front yards. So that's just a minor correction".
