

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD JULY 12, 2005.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: Councilmember Catano. (excused).

Pastor Phil Cookes from South Bay Celebration Assembly of God Church gave the evening's invocation. Guy Hocker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi welcomed Bill Salfity as the evening's representative from the Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor Guidi asked for continued prayers for the Rendon family who suffered a tragedy when their 13 month old baby was accidentally run over by a family member. Mayor Guidi thanked those in the South Bay community who quickly came together with monetary donations to help the family. Funds left over after expenses were donated to the Leslie Zepeda Foundation.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Mayor **Guidi** publicly thanked Mr. Dick Huhn for ordering an anti graffiti sealer to protect the Beach Boys monument.

Councilmember **Velez** congratulated the Nibels for their Citizens of the Year award.

Councilmember **Velez** thanked those who contributed to the Rendon family and to the group than made possible the trip for the kids to go to Germany.

Councilmember **Velez** stated that despite the ordinance that was passed regarding fireworks, people were still using fireworks illegally so we need to reconsider for next year.

Councilmember Velez asked for an ordinance that would cut down on the number of shopping carts abandoned throughout the city.

Councilmember **Velez** wished associate planner Alvie Betancourt the best and thanked him for his service with the city.

Councilmember **Parsons** discussed the possibility of modifying our ordinance to allow legal fireworks only for one day on the 4th of July.

Councilmember **Parsons** got to go see our Airforce reserve in action on a training mission and took part in an air-to-air refueling of an F-16.

Councilmember **Parsons** stated that he got a letter saying that the bus benches on Prairie and El Segundo are missing.

Councilmember **Parsons** reported that the grass at the southern end of Glasgow Park is going brown and asked that the sprinklers be checked. Also asked that the street signs for the park be installed.

Councilmember **Parsons** asked that someone look into the policy that makes a homeowner pay for public sidewalk repair when they do a major remodel as this policy seems unfair to the homeowner.

Councilmember **Lambert** was disappointed that residents booed police officers doing their duty in Hollyglen to enforce the fireworks ordinance.

Councilmember **Lambert** congratulated the Nibels for their award, the Chamber for the event in El Segundo and to all the wonderful people that contributed to the Rendon family.

Mayor **Guidi** congratulated the Nibels and thanked those who contributed to the Rendon family.

Mayor **Guidi** reported that Councilmember Catano and Senator Vincent were in Sacramento fighting for the vehicle license fee on behalf of the city.

Mayor **Guidi** reminded everybody that the custom car show to support Teen Challenge will be held at Memorial Park on July 23rd from 10 am to 3 pm.

Mayor **Guidi** has received several calls from residents complaining about the yellow buses parked in their neighborhoods after business hours. If they are parked after 4 pm in residential neighborhoods, Mayor Guidi asked that they be towed as they are violating the city ordinance regarding commercial vehicles parked in residential neighborhoods.

Mayor **Guidi** wished Councilmember Lambert a happy birthday.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** congratulated the Nibels.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked those who supported the various groups asking for donations.

City Clerk **Juarez** thanked Larry Bender for the new cable department format on channel 22.

City Clerk **Juarez** reminded everyone to come out and support the Airfaire on August 13th.

City Clerk **Juarez** stated that the Parks and Recreation Foundation is accepting donations for the Beach Boys monument in order to reimburse Harry Jarnogan for all the work he did on the project.

Mayor **Guidi** asked to look into the possibility of reopening Northrop Avenue as a public street.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked the Hawthorne Press Tribune for correcting the story on Hawthorne's crime rate.

Under oral communications, **Darlene Love** thanked the Mayor on behalf Olivet Lutheran Church for bringing the barbeque pit to their fundraiser. **Debra White** requested the use of facilities at Memorial Park in order to hold a memorial in remembrance of her son Victor who was the victim of a random shooting in his front yard. **Walt Dixon**, 4378 W. 138th St., announced that I was the city's 83rd birthday. **Francis Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., would like to have one-way streets from 118th to 120th on Eucalyptus and Gale. **Jerry and Kathryn Nibel** thanked the Council, Chamber of Commerce and anyone involved in bestowing the honor of Citizens of the Year onto them.

No one else indicated a desire to be heard.
