

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD JULY 13, 2004.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: None.

The evening's invocation was given by Darlene Love. Allen Richards led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Don Harris, President of the Chamber of Commerce, introduced the new Board of Directors for the Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor Guidi with concurrence from the City Council, wished Mr. Jan Vogel Executive Director for the South Bay Workforce Investment Board a Happy Birthday.

1.

Mayor Guidi recessed the City Council meeting to conduct a closed session regarding Conference with Labor Negotiators (Subdivision (a) of Section 54957.6 of the California Government Code. Name of Labor Negotiator: Jeff Freedman (re: Executive Group).

Mayor Guidi called the City Council meeting back to order following recess with all Councilmembers present, except for Councilmember Catano who was excused. He announced that the closed session was to discuss Conference with Labor Negotiators (Subdivision (a) of Section 54957.6 of the California Government Code. Name of Labor Negotiator: Jeff Freedman (re: Executive Group) and legal staff has been advised.

Under Councilmember Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Velez** moved seconded by Mayor **Guidi** to agendize putting a stop sign on 122nd and Freeman because of too many accidents.

Councilmember **Velez** spoke on a problem with the trash enclosure behind RiteAid on 132nd, which is being overfilled with trash.

Councilmember **Velez** noticed two tubs of oil in the street that were not being picked up and asked that employees be on the lookout for these types of incidents and to report them.

Councilmember **Velez** asked for some way to limit the number of nail and hair salons on the boulevard.

Councilmember **Velez** asked for an update on the mini-motorcycle task force.

Councilmember **Velez** questioned the purpose of some bricks on an empty lot on Grevillea.

Councilmember **Velez** attended the opening of the new Gas Company building.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that there will be a ballot initiative on the November ballot (Prop. 65) that would let us keep the monies that we get from such things as property tax and sales tax.

Councilmember **Parsons** stated that you can stop getting pre approved credit card applications in the mail, which can lead to identity theft, by calling 888-567-8688.

Councilmember **Lambert** thanked staff and department heads for their dedicated contribution in putting together the budget.

Councilmember **Lambert** attended the Gas Company opening.

Councilmember **Lambert** inquired if the police respond to persons stealing recyclables from the curb.

Councilmember **Lambert** inquired if we have an option to demand that every owner on the boulevard clean up the front of their own sidewalk.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that the Cockatoo is probably going to be rehabbed and redeveloped and anyone interested in this project can attend the Planning Commission meeting on August 4th at 6:30 pm.

Mayor **Guidi** stated that the Police Department is handling the recyclers and they have different teams on different nights in the city.

Mayor **Guidi** and Councilmember **Velez** had the opportunity to go out to the DUI checkpoint on Rosecrans and Isis. Mayor Guidi was amazed to see the amount of people that are still drinking and driving.

Mayor **Guidi** asked that the Police and City Manager work to find a solution for the fireworks problem.

Mayor **Guidi** requested that a conditional use permit given to a church on 142nd be investigated as it is causing parking problems for business owners in the area.

Mayor **Guidi** would like to do a sidewalk assessment on both sides of Hawthorne Blvd. and other major streets in the city.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that he will be co-sponsoring with Ken Chiang with the State Board of Equalization, a small business summit at the Memorial Center on August 6th.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that the Chamber of Commerce would like to invite everybody to an open house on July 29th from 4 pm to 8 pm.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that on July 27th, Time Warner's state of the art Surf Shack will visit City Hall from 4 pm to 6 pm. Surf Shack contains all the bells and whistles of the technology revolution.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired about making more parking available to business owners on Hawthorne Blvd. who want to expand their businesses.

Councilmember **Parsons** shared how the Hawthorne Rotary Interact Club, which is composed of Hawthorne High students, participated in the 9th Annual Lennox Family Festival by reading to 400 children and adults. Councilmember **Parsons** encouraged everyone to join a service club and get involved in the community.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that Congresswoman Maxine Waters will be coming to Hawthorne on July 31st from 2 to 4 pm to discuss local issues.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** walked Hawthorne Blvd. and reported that there are very few trash cans between El Segundo and Rosecrans.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** reminded that the Cancer Walk is coming up in August and also the Air Fair.

Mayor **Guidi** congratulated City Clerk **Juarez**' soccer team for winning the nationals.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the November election is fast approaching and encouraged people to participate in this process. October 18th is the last day to register in order to vote in this election.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the County has established a Corporate Poll Worker program.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the Diabetes Walk will be held on September 26th. City Clerk Juarez is this year's chairman.

Mayor **Guidi** reported on a problem with parking at 7-11 due to a building that was split into two businesses and asked that this be researched.

Councilmember **Lambert** thanked Councilmember **Velez** for filling in for her at a meeting of the SBCOG.

Councilmember **Lambert** discussed the possibility of having the homeowner associations bring up to the homeowners whether they are in favor of getting rid of fireworks altogether.

Under oral communications, **Ronnie Manson**, announced that a board member of his radio team is in the hospital. **Sandra Suarez**, was here to defend and preserve such honors as proclamations, awards, and recognition that deserving people earn and not devalue them by giving them to undeserving people. **Cathy Lawson**, concerned that Hollyglen Park has become overcrowded during holidays and weekends, causing safety issues such as the passage of emergency vehicles, overcrowding, lack of permits and air quality. **Allen Richards**, 13828 S. Ramona Ave., spoke on illegal fireworks and how they abused the peace and quiet of the neighborhoods. Feels it is time to stop fireworks once and for all. **Paul Lowe**, 11613 Haas Ave., inquired if it is legal to dump trash in the park bins. **Victor Hugo Rosario**, 4857 W. 118th Pl., asked for assistance in resolving a situation whereby a neighbor widened her driveway and as a result, created a lake in front of Mr. Rosario's house. **Darlene Love**, 2003 W. 116th St., reported that there is a problem with trash in the alley behind the church at 2506 W. Imperial Hwy. **Pat Carey**, 4588 W. 130th St., inquired about getting a second container for trash. Invited everyone to the Hawthorne Airport Community Association (HACA) potluck annual general membership meeting at 6:00 pm on Monday night at Security Aviation. Announced that the Hawthorne Airfair will be on August 14th. For those that wish to participate, call the museum at (310) 322-6228. **Cindy Parsons**, 5428 W. 140th St., asked for the city's support to encourage the school district to keep all pickups and drop-offs on 135th St. as opposed to 134th St. **Frances Stiglich**, suggested deputizing volunteers and putting them in uniform. Likes the idea of giving a 1/4% tax for the police. Suggested a crosswalk at 126th and Prairie. Requested all expenditures on what it costs to run the senior center.

No one else indicated a desire to be heard.

City Clerk Daniel D. Juarez announced that this was the time and place for the public hearing Regarding Proposed Annual Budget including Projected Revenue and Requested Appropriations for Fiscal Year 2004-2005.

The City Clerk submitted declaration of publication which was ordered filed. No written communications were received.

Assistant Finance Director, Jag Pathirana gave a brief explanation on the budget.

Councilmember Lambert requested her comments for the record:

“I just wanted to be on record saying that I’m not happy about cutting, I think it was, was it \$100,000 from the police department for overtime? That makes me very uncomfortable, but I’ll tell you what satisfies me if by the grace of God we are able to get that, is it quarter cent? On the books in November, it’s supposed to be on the ballot. This city stands to gain approximately \$4.2 million. If I didn’t... I’m sorry? \$4 million, okay. But if I didn’t see that on the horizon and I believe there shouldn’t be one person that wouldn’t approve a quarter cent and I’m hoping all of you are listening carefully because that gives money to all the police departments across this county. And it will also enforce our police department, but homeland security, which is becoming even more and more critical everyday. So, I just want to be on record saying that I do really object to cutting down this overtime because in my mind, first and foremost, is fire and police no matter what. No matter what ever else happens in our city, fire and police comes first. But with that on the horizon, I’m praying that we will have people vote for it. The other thing is I wanted to say on the record that I thank, she’s not here tonight, but, and I wasn’t here for this budget hearing because it was postponed on the agenda, so I missed it. I had to leave. But I think she’s done a fine job and she’s accepted some of our changes and the gentlemen’s changes and I think she’s done a very, very, fine job and we should give her credit for all the work and your department as well. All of you, I want to thank you very much for a really good job that you did, okay. Thank you”.

Under oral comments, no one indicated a desire to be heard.

Mayor Guidi ordered to close the public portion of the hearing. MOTION CARRIED.
