

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA, HELD AUGUST 9, 2005**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: None.

Pastor Arthur McKibben of the Church of the Nazarene gave the evening's invocation. City Manager Rick Prentice led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Hannibal Sullivan of the Los Angeles Area Council of the Boy Scouts gave a quick state of scouting in the City of Hawthorne. Last year Hawthorne produced over 15 Eagle Scouts. The Los Angeles Area Council through aggressive fundraising is going to be out providing programs and service opportunities for the youth of the city.

Candy Cardelfuller and Patricia Feldman proposed the following business venture with the City of Hawthorne and the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce: a farmer's market that would provide fresh fruit and flowers, nursery stock, baked goods and a food court and other related items to the residents and the surrounding cities. It would be held every Saturday from 9 am to 1 pm at 126<sup>th</sup> Street near city hall. Mayor Guidi requested a meeting to be held so they can assign a couple of people that would work together on this project with Patricia and Candy.

A slide show presentation was given on the status of the bocce courts renovation at the Memorial Center. The courts are courtesy of Elite Homes and should be finished in 60 days.

Mayor Guidi recessed the City Council meeting to conduct a closed session regarding Conference with Labor Negotiator pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.6. Agency Negotiator: Jeff Freedman - Employee Organizations: All Employee Groups.

Mayor Guidi called the City Council meeting back to order following recess with all Councilmembers present. He announced that the closed session was to discuss Conference with Labor Negotiator pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.6. Agency Negotiator: Jeff Freedman - Employee Organizations: All Employee Groups and the City Attorney Glen Shishido announced that the negotiator was instructed and that no action was taken.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Lambert** spoke on a letter received from the office of Michael Antonovich that stated the present new mayor of Los Angeles wants to hereafter appoint all the school board members in the districts. Councilmember Lambert asked that a letter be written to oppose this action.

Councilmember **Lambert** thanked Mr. Jan Vogel for getting funds through South Bay Workforce Investment Board to repair areas that were affected by bad weather.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that the Chamber of Commerce will be holding a state line turnaround fundraiser on August 27<sup>th</sup> from 6 am to 10 pm. Cost is \$25.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that the Air Show will be held on August 13<sup>th</sup>.

Councilmember **Lambert** asked that a letter to take down an obscene billboard bordering Los Angeles be written to the owner and to the Board of Supervisors.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the groundbreaking of the bocce ball courts.

Councilmember **Parsons** spent time with those in the Air Force reserve and presented pictures from a soldier's point of view of what it is like to be in Iraq right now. Air Force Reservists took pictures.

Councilmember **Parsons** suggested that a section aimed at moviemakers be put on the website.

Councilmember **Parsons** assured the citizens of Hawthorne that the city will never use eminent domain to take personal residences in order to make room for a shopping center.

Mayor **Guidi** asked that a resolution be prepared opposing the Supreme Court on their new ruling of eminent domain.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that thanks to the passing of Proposition 1A, when the state passed their budget, they did not come to local cities to take away money.

Councilmember **Parsons** asked that letters be written to the shop owners at Rosecrans and Prairie advising them that the Bodger Park neighborhood is behind their shopping center and to please not play loud music at night.

Councilmember **Parsons** stated that a residential wall abutting a commercial development can be as high as 10 feet.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on how the city is doing in regards to the state requirement of recycling 50% of the city's trash.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on the status of the audit on Time Warner. The audit is to make sure that we are getting our fair share of the franchise fee. It was reported that the audit is half way done.

Councilmember **Velez** announced that there will be a jazz festival put on by Mayor Guidi, the Chamber of Commerce and others on August 20<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor **Guidi** suggested mid street stop signs or speed humps for the area on 147<sup>th</sup> where the new Gold's Gym will be opening as there is a problem with speeding in this area.

Mayor **Guidi** met with the residents of Del Aire to address problems with speeding.

Mayor **Guidi** has been made aware that there is a house in the 4500 block of 133<sup>rd</sup> Street that is in a probate war and neighbors are concerned that once the house is sold, two or three high-density houses may be built on the lot.

Mayor **Guidi** attended a press conference for Maxine Waters where it was announced that different cities received funds. The funds that Hawthorne received were over \$2 million for the widening of the Rosecrans and Aviation turn lanes.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that funds collected from the August 20<sup>th</sup> Jazz Festival will go back to the community.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that August 21<sup>st</sup> is open Mosque Day from 10 am to 5 pm at the Hawthorne Islamic Center.

Under oral communications, **Kamla Sullivan**, introduced Media Arts Academy at Centinela, a free high school diploma program chartered by the Centinela Valley Union High School District. They are a school that utilizes project based learning through technology, small class sizes, real life skills and community service learning. Job training and soft skill services are also offered. Orientation for enrollment will be held August 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 and August 20<sup>th</sup> at 10 am at 3701 Rosecrans Ave. For additional information, call 310-263-1022. **Philip and Jacquelyn Jones** asked for more police patrol in the Hollypark area as there has recently been a rash of burglaries in the area. Asked for help to get the property at 3636 Imperial cleaned up. **Claudia Fishler**, Hawthorne Library 12700 Grevillea, announced that the Friends of the Hawthorne Library will present a program on August 20<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 am featuring our own Walt Dixon who will be doing a book talk and autograph. **Francis Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., stated that for three weeks the sweeper has not come to the vacant lot and people who are throwing trash in the lot should be fined. Spoke on problems with a boombox and a lot of parked cars on her street. **Allen Hamblin**, 11519 Gale Ave., thanked everybody at the city for the improvements on Gale Ave. There is also an issue of a neighbor with loud music on Monday nights around 6 pm.
