

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA, HELD SEPTEMBER 28, 2004.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: None.

Darlene Love gave the invocation for the evening. Girl Scout Troop #750 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented Girl Scout Troop #750 with a Certificate of Merit for its service to the community as the Color Guard at the September 28, 2004 Hawthorne City Council meeting.

Claudia Fishler, Manager of the Hawthorne Library, introduced the West County Regional Manager for the West region, Steven Klein. Ms. Fishler's goal is to make Hawthorne Library a one-stop place for all of Hawthorne's information needs.

Mayor Guidi presented a Proclamation to the Hawthorne Big Dogs AYSO Region 21 for their record 54 wins, one loss and six ties.

Cora Travers, Pam Fees and Norm Morton from the Board of the Hawthorne President's Council, presented an \$8000 check to Police Chief Stephen Port for the Canine Training and Equipment Fund. The donation was made possible through a community dinner that was held in the city.

Herb Child of Access Community Housing and Frank Ferdon of Century Housing presented a concept to develop a mixed used village in Hawthorne featuring home ownership.

Under Council Report and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Lambert** attended the public hearing regarding the City Concourse project near the courthouse. There will be another hearing on the 6<sup>th</sup>.

Councilmember **Lambert** cautioned voters to wait until they receive their large pamphlets from Sacramento in order to better understand the issues on the ballot for November.

Councilmember **Catano** inquired on the policy of double parking as the problem is getting worse and suggested that we take a zero tolerance approach on offenders by giving them tickets instead of just telling them to move.

Councilmember **Catano** inquired on the feasibility of hiring reserve police officers to do parking enforcement.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the AYSO opening ceremonies, the Hawthorne Chamber Women's Mixer, the St. Joseph Fiesta, the California Youth Karate Championship and a life and death drama at Del Aire Assembly of God Church.

Councilmember **Catano** announced that the Lions and the City will be sponsoring a car show on October 17<sup>th</sup> at Memorial Park on Prairie and El Segundo.

Councilmember **Catano** walked the 10k on Sunday for the Diabetes Walk. His team raised \$665.

Councilmember **Parsons** is in support of the county residents trying to fight the Trammel Crow project. He feels that at 90 units per acre, the project's density is too high.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that RFK Hospital will shut down at the end of the year. This will affect residents in the community, as paramedics will have to drive farther to get to an emergency room.

Councilmember **Parsons** attended the League of California Cities annual convention in Long Beach. Among topics of discussion were the rising cost of health care and what other cities are doing to take control of the costs, ethics ordinances, mixed use housing/commercial, base closures and Prop. 1A.

Councilmember **Parsons** reminded those who live in single family residential neighborhoods to call H&C when they have a bulky item pickup as they are entitled to two free bulky item pickups a year.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that various streets will be repaired in the city. Streets include Gale, Eucalyptus, Roselle, Doty, Cordary and Grevillea.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that on October 7<sup>th</sup> there will be a Pediatric Aids Walk to raise money for research on treating juveniles with aids. The walk starts on Century Blvd. by the airport.

Councilmember **Velez** thanked Chief Port and his staff for the police station grand opening.

Councilmember **Velez** urged everybody to keep an eye out for graffiti.

Councilmember **Velez** announced that the grand opening for Eucalyptus Park will be held on October 9 at 11:00 am.

Councilmember **Velez** was approached by former Mayor Gordon to see if the city would be willing to contribute \$20,000 to a campaign committee to fight the closure of the air force base.

Councilmember **Velez** moved seconded by Councilmember **Parsons** to see if the city would be willing to contribute \$20,000 to a campaign committee to fight the closure of the air force base.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that the St. Joseph was a great success again this year.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that Councilmember Catano, Velez and himself received the Los Angeles Sheriff's Academy California Youth Karate National Honor of Distinguished Outstanding Community Leader.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that Jefferson School finally opened their new additions.

Mayor **Guidi** stated that former Mayor Gordon, Mayor Kelly McDow and himself met with two of the directors of RFK for an emergency meeting on the day after the press release for closure came out and stated that there are several people interested in buying the hospital.

Mayor **Guidi** would like to hold a meeting with City Manager Prentice and Chief Port to see about redesigning the city website without using general fund money.

Mayor **Guidi** announced the Custom Car Show on October 17 at the Memorial Center from 10 to 3. Proceeds will be donated back to the public.

Councilmember **Catano** inquired on the feasibility of getting another stop sign at 126<sup>th</sup> and Oxford due to some accidents and near misses.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** attended the opening ceremonies for AYSO.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** attended the grand opening for the police station and congratulated the police department.

City Clerk **Juarez** attended the kickoff of the Kids in Sports Hugs and Kisses Soccer program.

City Clerk **Juarez** congratulated Don Harris for the workshop with the Health Department and restaurant owners.

City Clerk **Juarez** had the opportunity to help with the South Bay Workforce Investment Board audit. The results indicate that services improved from last year.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the Lions and Rotarians will be involved in the corporate poll worker program and asked if the Kiwanis would be involved also.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that the last date to register to vote is October 18<sup>th</sup>.

City Clerk **Juarez** announced that over 1900 walkers participated in the Diabetes Walk and thanked Larry Bender for providing volunteers for the event.

Under oral communications, **Jim Matthews**, 5250 Wiseburn Ave., who was the Corporate Development Sponsorship Chairperson for the Diabetes Walk, thanked Danny Juarez for his leadership and guidance and presented a contribution of \$900 from friends, family and coworkers. **Jim Lissner**, spoke on traffic signal timing and asked that the left turn yellows be lengthened from three to four seconds because it would reduce the number of violations by two thirds or more. **Ammar Kahf**, 13001 Doty, suggested some kind of awareness campaign to get people to stop littering the streets. **Sheri Lewis**, spoke on the crime that took place at 120<sup>th</sup> and Crenshaw. The victim was her nephew. Appealed to the Council for help in finding her nephew's murderer. There will be a rally this Sunday at Lowes and asked that the community and Council come out and support the rally. Unidentified speaker spoke in support of a stop sign at Jefferson and 134<sup>th</sup>. **Louis Bankdon**, 4067 134<sup>th</sup> St., presented a list with the names of people in thanks for the stop sign at Jefferson and 134<sup>th</sup> St. **Mike Wysocki**, 5344 Wiseburn, feels there should be a ban or some type of excessive fee for motor homes that are permanently parked on the streets of Hollyglen as they obstruct driver's vision of traffic and bring down property values. **Robert Fasing**, 140<sup>th</sup> St., suggested putting cameras in the streets to catch those who litter. **Cindy Parsons**, 140<sup>th</sup> St., thanked the organizers of the Diabetes Walk. On behalf of Georgina Briggs, thanked everyone who donated to the Cancer Relay held in Hawthorne.
