

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD OCTOBER 12, 2004.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Patricia Feldman gave the evening's invocation. Francis Stiglitch led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi introduced Patricia Feldman as the evening's representative from the Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Recognition to Corey and JoAnne Birdsall of Hugs and Kisses on behalf of Corey's Brats, girls softball.

Councilmember Lambert presented a Proclamation to Abraham Amanos of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health in honor of National Health Education Week.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the American Legion barbeque.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the Office Depot grand opening. Is pleased that many of the employees are from Hawthorne.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the Eucalyptus Park grand opening and feels this is a great addition to that side of town.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the Jose Marti Club Cuban Festival and the Chamber of Commerce Women's Business Club.

Councilmember **Lambert** encouraged businesses to join the Business Women's Council, which is part of the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that Dorothy Perry was injured over this past weekend by a car and asked that we include her in our prayers.

Councilmember **Lambert** thanked City Clerk Danny Juarez for coming to her church on Sunday to help with the registration of voters.

Councilmember **Lambert** stated that she has not seen any new signs around the city prohibiting littering.

Councilmember **Lambert** inquired if there is a way to find out from the finance director on how much money is yet owed to the general fund from the redevelopment agency.

Commended the Council and the city on the fine job that was done with Eucalyptus Park. **Carol & Rick DeVusser**, 4444 W. 134th St., announced that they would be moving from Hawthorne come the end of the month, but would still continue helping out the city. **Jerry Nibel**, 12125 Menlo Ave., thanked the Council and all connected with the process of getting a stop sign for 122nd and Menlo. Commended Mickey Winters on the park. Feels H&C Disposal should be sent a letter of recommendation for all their contributions at city functions. **Walt Dixon**, 4378 W. 138th St., is looking for pictures of Hawthorne Blvd., primarily Hawthorne Blvd., east side of the street from El Segundo south and particularly the Centinela Café from the outside. The pictures are for a pictorial book being written about the City of Hawthorne. Pictures can be brought to City Hall or to the Car Show at the Memorial Center this coming Sunday. **Norb Huber**, 13919 Eucalyptus Ave., voiced disapproval of Measure H, the school bond issue. Feels the school board approved this bond measure illegally without public input. **Allan Hamblin**, regarding the Leslie Zepeda redevelopment area, is looking forward to seeing some action moving forward in that arena. City Clerk Daniel D. Juarez announced that this was the time and place for the public hearing on General Plan Amendment No. 2004GP02 and Change of Zone No. 2004CZ02 re: Applicant Elite Homes, Inc.'s request to amend the general plan designation on Lot 121 from public facilities to High Density Residential (R-3) and change the zoning on Lot 121 (35,840 square feet) from Limited Industrial to High-Density Residential on property located at 13436 Roselle Avenue, in order to bring the subject lot into conformity with the surrounding general plan and zoning designations. The result of approving the General Plan Amendment and the Change of zone would create a 71,680 square foot lot (1.64 acres) located in a High-Density Residential (R-3)

The City Clerk submitted declaration of mailing/posting/publication which was ordered filed. No written communications were received.

Under oral comments, Francis Stiglich stated that there was only three feet between the fence and the house and feels that should be increased.

No one else indicated a desire to be heard.
