

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD DECEMBER 14, 2004.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting and Housing Authority to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.

Darlene Love gave the evening's invocation. Councilmember Gary Parsons led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk Daniel D. Juarez presented plaques to participants of the 15th Annual American Diabetes Association Walk. The event was held on September 26, 2004 at Veterans Park in Redondo Beach. Chairman Juarez was also presented with a plaque for his leadership and dedication.

City Clerk Daniel Juarez gave his Certification of the Official Results of the returns of the General Municipal Election held November 2, 2004 as follows:

Pursuant to the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California, the Registrar-Recorder of the County of Los Angeles canvassed the returns of said Special Municipal Election and has certified the results attached hereto and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A" and I now certify to you as follows:

That there were thirty two (32) voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election, consisting of consolidations of the special election precincts in said city as established for the holding of state and county elections.

That said Special Municipal Election was held for the purpose of making it unlawful to sell, use or discharge fireworks of any kind within the City of Hawthorne.

That the whole number of votes cast in said city except absent voter ballots was 9649.

That the whole number of absent voter ballots cast in said city was 1598 making a total of 11,247 votes cast in said city.

I hereby certify that the majority of voters voting on the measure did not vote in favor of the measure.

The City Clerk's Statement and the certification of the canvass is now ready to be ordered filed.

Under oral communications, **Carol and Rick DeVusser** presented baked goods to the Council. **Eric Lee**, 14650 Aviation Blvd, #207, asked the city to examine an ordinance that classifies acupuncture as an adult industry business and requires a permit for an unclassified use. **Ronnie Manson**, 11856 Inglewood, had a medical emergency over the weekend, but due to the closure and overflow of RFK Hospital, had to wait 15 hours at Centinela Hospital due the overflow. Hopes that RFK can still be kept as an hospital. **Linda Bush**, 12110 Burl Ave., complained of jet departure noise at LAX that starts in the evening and lasts all night long and requested that we reconsider suing LAX for the damage that they are doing to the neighborhood and to the residents. **Tony Dauer**, complained that the bike path by the base was closed without anybody from his neighborhood being told about it. **Oscar Robles**, Vice President of the Parent Advisory Committee of Hawthorne Math and Science Academy, thanked Mayor Guidi and Councilmembers Lambert and Parsons for their support by attending the HMSA community open house barbeque on November 20th. **Helen Nivar Martinez**, expressed great disappointment over the closing of the bike path and asked that it be reopened or create a safe way to get the kids from Del Aire and the surrounding Hawthorne areas into the middle schools and library. **Darlene Love** thanked council for the one-way street. Inquired on where to call when reporting graffiti. **Bob Farrell** of Hawthorne VFW inquired on the use of generators for the fireworks stands. **Frances Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., shared the amounts of salaries that mayors and councils from other cities are paid and inquired on why Hawthorne does not have their own bus. **Georgey Martini** frequents the senior center and asked that rules concerning the ages of who can come into the senior center be enforced. Stated that some seniors did not get any turkey at the Thanksgiving senior luncheon due to miscalculation in attendance and hopes that it doesn't happen again at the Christmas dinner.
