

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD JULY 25, 2006.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, Housing Authority and Public Financing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: Councilmember Velez (excused).

Darlene Love gave the evening's Invocation. Girl Scout Troop #750 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Merit to Girl Scout Troop #750 for its service to the community as the color guard for the July 25, 2006 Hawthorne City Council meeting.

Dick Huhn, Norm Morton and Pam Fees of the President's Council presented an \$8,000 check to Chief Stephen Port for the Hawthorne Police Department's K-9 unit. Funds were raised at a community dinner held on May 18<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Guidi welcomed new business Wescom Credit Union to the community. They are located on Crenshaw and 120<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Guidi introduced Patricia Feldman, the new Chamber of Commerce President.

Under oral communications, **Tim Ostensen**, 5336 W. 137<sup>th</sup> St., 7051 suggested that instead of outright prohibiting block parties, create stricter rules and a stricter permit process. **Olivia Valentine**, 2519 W. 119<sup>th</sup> Pl., as president of the Hollypark HOA, extended an invitation to the Council and the public to attend their first membership recruitment drive "Day at the Park" on Saturday August 5<sup>th</sup> from 12 to 5 pm. **Sally Downie and Dorothy Sweeney** were going to address the block party issue, but the item was pulled. **Mike Mares** inquired on police investigation regarding his car. **Fernando Villegas** inquired on the situation regarding the handball courts and why the permit parking signs in his neighborhood were removed. **Frances Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., feels the handball courts should be taken out. On behalf of Claudette Taylor, inquired on why the City doesn't have a bus for the disabled. Reported that kids are playing in the streets and are also riding their bikes without helmets and weaving in and out of traffic. **Randall Kemos**, representing Frank Scotto Towing, gave a brief overview of Frank Scotto Towing and asked that the City consider selecting them as the city's towing company.

No one else indicated a desire to be heard.

Mayor/Chairman Guidi ordered oral communications closed.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Mayor **Guidi** congratulated Mr. Allen Richards for a great Ramona newspaper. Announced that the Ramona Neighborhood Picnic will be held at Ramona Park this Saturday. Read from a newspaper article regarding officials trying to save local FAA jobs. Thanked Mr. Jan Vogel for always keeping on top of helping with jobs. Clarified that an article stating we had received \$1.8 million CDBG funds were not new funds, but rather money allotted to us. Spoke on article reminiscing on past Hawthorne parades. Started a pilot program on his street that more equally distributes the parking spots in front of homes. Stated that a business section of 129<sup>th</sup> and Hawthorne Blvd. has been refurbished with CDBG funds. Suggested options for block parties such as not allowing them on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July but allowing them on other occasions.

Councilmember **Parsons** requested that the next time there are huge EIRs to review, that Council be given a week to review instead of a couple of days. Suggested some ideas for possible ordinances regarding block parties such as limiting the hours of block parties to 6 or 7 pm. Announced that on Thursday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, the Hollyglen HOA will have there annual picnic at 6:30 at Glasgow Strip

Attended the Teen Challenge Car Show and the grand opening of Breastlink Group. Thanked Sgt. Chidley for sending the police bbq to an area in the city that lost power on Saturday and to McCormack Ambulance for taking care of the food bill.

**Subject:** Award Non-Exclusive Agreement for Police Referred Towing & Storage Contract. Six tow companies responded to the City's RFP. The tow companies that responded were evaluated by Staff and a summary of their evaluation is attached to the Agenda as Exhibit "A."

**Action:** Select two contractors, one primary and one back-up, to receive awards of non-exclusive contracts for City police-referred towing services. Three contractors--Van Lingen, US Tow and Scotto Towing--were all rated by the Police Department as meeting the critical criteria to perform such services for the City.

Councilmember Lambert moved, seconded by Councilmember Catano to Award Non-Exclusive Agreement for Police Referred Towing & Storage Contract to U.S Tow and Scotto Towing as their backup.

For the record Councilmember Lambert comments:

"I just have one tiny little correction. Not a correction, but an observation. I think that if you would look on your page 14 and my colleagues. Two weeks ago we were out there and we had a birthday cake at the kindness of the Mayor and the City Council. And I was out there with all of them and a gentleman approached me whom I had never seen before. And it just bothered me a little bit here because it said his presence and conversation with City of Hawthorne officials on behalf of this particular tow company that might be viewed as a direct violation of the RFP. I want you to know that the gentleman who stood up this tall above me and said happy birthday Ginny and I said who are you? So I really didn't know who he was and chief if that's what you observed or whoever observed that, I have never laid eyes on the man before in my life. So I wanted to just clear the air. You were kind enough to say down here the committee feels that it should not be viewed as a violation and it was not a violation anyway because I'd never seen him before and I didn't know who he was. So, that having been said, I would appreciate that on the record".
