

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD MARCH 14, 2006.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency and Parking Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Pastor Arthur McKibben from the Church of the Nazarene gave the evening's Invocation. City Attorney Glen Shishido led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented a Proclamation to the Hawthorne High School Boy's Varsity Basketball Team in recognition of winning the Ocean League Boy's Basketball Championship.

Under oral communications, **Claudia Fishler** of the Hawthorne Library, announced that the Friends of the Library will be holding a book and bake sale on April 1<sup>st</sup> from 9 am to 3 pm. They already have 3500 books but donations are still welcome. **Margaret Jeppesen**, 11830 S. Gale, asked for help regarding trash problem at 11829 S. Gale. **Ferris Schick**, asked for clarification of how Ordinance 1841 will be enforced. **Darlene Love** announced that her grandson Steve received the Principal's Award for being an outstanding student at Hawthorne High School. **Ed Rega** spoke on behalf of Ordinance 1847. **Frances Stiglich** inquired if there is an ordinance to keep the front of apartment buildings clean. Suggested a volunteer car to enforce trash issues.
