

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD SEPTEMBER 26, 2006.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:06 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Public Hearing on Appeal of Planning Commission Resolution 2006-26, approving Century Business Center Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 65804 and Community Project 2006PD01. Northrop Grumman Corp submitted an application appealing Planning Commission Resolution 2006-26, approving Century Business Center Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 65804 and Community Project 2006PD01. The appeal is generally based on the fact that the applicant, MS Kearny Northrop LLC, did not own the 6 acres located east of Crenshaw Boulevard and therefore cannot request approval for its subdivision into 11 parcels, nor its inclusion in the Community Project.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that this matter be referred back to the Planning Commission to conduct a new Public Hearing on **1) Final EIR for Century Business Center, 2) General Plan Amendment 2006GP01, Century Business Center Specific Plan, 3) Zone Code Amendment 2006ZA05, 4) Change of Zone 2006CZ03, 5) Vesting Tentative Tract Map 65804, 6) Community Project 2006PD01, and 7) Development Agreement 2006DA01**, for the purpose of considering amendment of the Project Description to delete reference to the 6 acres located east of Crenshaw Boulevard. Motion to refer matter back to Planning Commission.

Planning Department's declaration of publication filed. No written communications were received. Call for oral comments. Motion-close hearing. Motion to Refer the Appeal back to the Planning Commission.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the St. Joseph Annual Rainbow Fiesta. Thanked the Cable TV department for doing the profiles on the different restaurants in the city.

Councilmember **Velez** commended the Chamber on the event they put together to bring all the businesses over.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on why a City audit was not made public to prosecutors in the S&W Towing case as mentioned in an article in the Daily Breeze. Regarding LAX, was briefed that the Tom Bradley terminal will be modernized and part of the contract is that 20% of the construction jobs must be local residents and 2% of the jobs will be by unskilled labor that will be trained in construction work. Contact LAX if interested. LAX will also restart a regional airport committee which will try to get Palmdale and Ontario airports more commercial air traffic.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked all the Departments and Police Department for the tremendous clean up in all the parks. On behalf of Councilmember Lambert, announced that she would like to put together a community meeting regarding homeland security. There is also a program for a Deputy Registrar Training from 1pm to 2:30 pm at the County Norwalk office on September 28th, October 4th and October 11th.
