

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD NOVEMBER 14, 2006.**

Under oral communications **Claudia Fishler**, 12700 Grevillea, reminded the public that the libraries will be closed on November 23rd and 24th. **Gordon Meego** thanked those who voted for him in the election when he ran for the 35th District. **Darlene Love**, 2003 W. 116th St., complained about the waiting time to return equipment pertaining to elections. **Francis Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., thanked Chief Heffner and all the police force for taking care of the problem on Gale Ave. and 116th. **Ramon Pulido**, Regional Commissioner for AYSO Region 21, clarified an incident that occurred on Glasgow relating to kids jumping fences to retrieve soccer balls on private properties. **Cindy Parsons**, President of the Hollyglen Homeowners Association, complimented the City and the Public Works department for the beautiful landscaping that was planted as part of the Rosecrans Widening Project.
