

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD JULY 10, 2007.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:05 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Lambert, Parsons, Velez, Mayor Guidi.

Absent: None.

Pat Feldman-Donaldson, Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce President, gave the evening's invocation. Officer Sean Galindo led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi acknowledged the Hawthorne Community Television staff for the honors they received at the 2007 SCAN NATOA-STAR awards held in May. This year they won three 1st place awards and four 2nd place awards.

A video promoting the 3rd Annual Teen Challenge/Mayor Larry Guidi Car Show was shown. It will be held on July 14th.

Under Elected Officials Report and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Velez** thanked Walt Dixon for reminding the Council that the 85th Anniversary of the city's incorporation is on July 12th. Reported on the status of the police helicopter stating that it passed the FAA inspection in June of 2007 and was flown to Whiteman Airport where it was thoroughly inspected and serviced. While being inspected it was noted that some parts were defective so replacement parts have been ordered. Due to this unexpected extra work, the helicopter will not be ready until the end of July.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the 2nd Annual Moose Lodge Horseshoe Tournament. Asked if there is way we can get together with Yvonne Burke's office, the county, and see if anything can be done about the fireworks on the county side.

Councilmember **Lambert** attended the Fusion opening. Congratulated Arnie Shadbehrr for the fine job he did on presenting an appeal to the SBCOG for extra money for a project on Crenshaw.

Mayor **Guidi** reported that in the area where he lives the fireworks situation was 150% better this year. There were less fireworks related calls this year compared to last year. Approximately 200lbs of illegal fireworks were confiscated. Fifty-four citations were issued totaling \$35,000. Received a letter from the County Assessor's office identifying Hawthorne as one of 10 cities that had the greatest magnitude of change in assessed valuation for 2007. South Bay Ford now sells Lincoln and Mercury. Announced the opening of a little Italian restaurant on Rosecrans near Ramona that serves great food. Received a petition from parents who live between Yukon and Kornblum on 135th Street by Zela Davis School requesting speed humps.

Councilmember **Parsons** congratulated the cable staff on their awards. Fireworks were a lot better this year. Suggested issuing press releases on positive things that happen in the city.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** congratulated the HCTV staff for their awards. Thanked the police task force for stopping by the fireworks stands every couple of hours to make sure everything was all right.

City Clerk **English** congratulated Larry Bender and the Hawthorne Cable and staff. Reported that the town hall on June 29th regarding the proposed jet fuel pipeline was well attended. The Assemblymember will continue to have town halls throughout the month of December. Announced that this Saturday is "Day at the Races" for seniors. Also, there is a homeowner, senior and renter's assistance tax credit booklets that are available through the Assemblymember's office at 310-412-6400. Announced that we are having an election this year in November and the filing period will open on July 16th to August 10th.

Under oral communications **Eddy Chapman**, 4310 W. 132nd St. #C requested a change in the hours for the community garden in order to give gardeners more flexibility and the opportunity to work in their gardens earlier in the morning before business hours when the weather is more permissible for working outside. **Jose Garcia** is not against housing at Prestige Villas but doesn't like the specific plan as it's laid out. **Steven Silver**, Attorney for HPOA, spoke against ordinance 1895 which would expand the amount of time that an individual could be reinstated into a former position. **Patricia Donaldson**, Owner of Abacus Security Services and President of the Chamber of Commerce, spoke in favor of housing at the RFK property as it would boost revenues for the city plus the Chamber gets a lot of phone calls from people that want to move into new homes. **Gordon Michael Meego**, 4535 W. 141st St., spoke against the Prestige Villas project as the specific plan would be contrary to the basic requirements of the Hawthorne Building Code. Feels this is more like a condominium project than a single family detached home project. **Don Harris**, 5412 W. 134th Pl., spoke in favor of Prestige Villas as it would be a good opportunity for Hawthorne to be on the leading edge and to attract the type of home buyers that we would want to have as citizens to come into our city to plant roots and invest in our city. **Alex Vargas**, 11981 S. York Ave., spoke against Prestige Villas. Feels it is another effort to bring the scourge of high density housing to the neighborhood with utter disregard to the well being of its community and the people who live within that community. Asked that the City Council reject this proposal for Prestige Villas, reject all three resolutions presented today related to Prestige Villas, reject all future attempts to bring high density housing to RFK, to maintain their pledge to keep a moratorium on all types of high density housing throughout the city and to continue to be creative and look for alternate uses for this site. **Francis Stiglich** spoke against Prestige Villas. Stated that half of the people did not even know this was going in. **Marti Dorouge**, 134th St., requested speed humps. **Grace Hanes**, 4632 W. 134th St., presented a petition for speed humps and stated that there was a hit and run accident on July 3rd and if there had been speed humps, the accident could have been prevented. **Sylvio Arapeke** spoke in support of Prestige Villas. Does not feel the density of the project would bring crime because people who qualify for these home's price range would not be involved in criminal activity. **Lily Fernandez**, 11322 Firmona, spoke against the project. **Allan Amble**, 11519 Gale Ave, opposes project because of issues with an antiquated sewer system, shortage of police officers, limited access for fire trucks and shortage of parking. **Nelson Saldivar**, Gale Ave., stated that a \$500,000 dollar house in the area would take two or three families living in the same house to pay the mortgage. **Torgen Navarez**, 4685 116th St., opposes this housing project because it would bring more problems and population. **Carl Swerver** feels this type of community that is being developed is ideal for families and Hawthorne.
