

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD AUGUST 14, 2007.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:05 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Father Gene from St. Joseph's Church gave the evening's invocation. Captain John Beerling led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Joe Bartells, on behalf of American Legion Post #314, presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Chief Heffner for the magnificent job that the police department did throughout the July 4<sup>th</sup> period.

Youth Commissioner Hugo Rojas announced the winners of the Anti Graffiti and Drug Poster/Essay contest. They included Sanna Sheik, third place; Assad Triena, second place and Ryan McDonald, first place.

A video highlighting the Leslie Zepeda Memorial Renovation Program Phase II was shown. The Leslie Zepeda Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser will be held on October 12<sup>th</sup> at Washington School.

Chief Heffner explained about Operation Golden Phoenix, an operation put together in case of disaster in Southern California. He apologized for noise that was caused by the helicopters. Unfortunately when the military came in, they changed their approach and flew over houses that were not notified.

**Under Elected Officials Report and Recommendations:**

**Discussion/Action Items:**

- Moratorium on Housing (Guidi)

Councilmember Lambert requested that a word for word version be put on the minutes.

**Mayor:** I had one agenda item. Well, was an action/discussion and I placed it on here, a moratorium on housing to start looking at it, slow it down maybe for a year and I think, Mr. Shishido, I'd requested some research. Tell me what happened.

**Shishido:** I have some comments on that. I do understand the impetus for wanting to do something like that. However, you know what, for the moratorium on housing we would have to make enhanced findings and I really don't believe we are able to do that. First of all, the moratorium would be an interim zoning ordinance and it's essentially an urgency ordinance. We would have to make findings that there is a need for an immediate preservation, you know, the need to act immediately for maintaining the status quo with regard to the health, safety and public welfare. That's going to be very tough to make, but in addition to that, there are new state law requirements with regard to moratoriums. In particular, making enhanced findings relative to housing and multi family housing. Essentially, what it requires is that to say that the city meets all its RHENA requirements Regional Housing Needs Assessments requirements. That there's no need for extra housing and frankly we're not able to make that finding.

- Reducing density on Residential R-3 zones (Lambert)

Councilmember Lambert passed on her agenda item due to time constraints.

Councilmember **Catano** explained about AB 1471, the Gun Crime Identification Act that would ensure that all semiautomatic handguns be micro stamped.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on how wide was information distributed to the residents regarding Operation Phoenix. Chief Heffner replied that fliers were passed out by the airport and behind the mall, north of 120<sup>th</sup> and around the 120<sup>th</sup> section of the airport as that was the area that they were told the demonstration would take place. Inquired of the public works director when the airport runway will be closed due to resurfacing. As of yet, there is no date.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked the Ramona Homeowner's Association for a fantastic picnic. Residents in the Ramona tract are concerned with all the trucks parked in the neighborhood. Would like notices sent to all the commissioners who would like to be reappointed. Anyone interested in joining the City of Hawthorne on a commission is encouraged to apply. A building on El Segundo and Hawthorne Blvd. has been granted rehab funds.

City Clerk **English** announced that tomorrow is the last day to submit nomination papers for anyone interested in running for city council.

Current policy is to have residents send a certified letter to the dog owner, copy Animal Control, then appear in court to get the dog owner to control the dog. A lot of residents won't go through all that, so he brought some suggestions for Council to look over at a later time. Another issue that has come up is regarding the late hour trash is being picked up. **Jose Carlo Gutierrez**, President of the Holly Park Homeowners Association, thanked Arnie Shadbehr, Alan Leung and the Council for the signage that will be going up near Cimarron School, making it a safer area for the kids. Announced that Holly Park will have their 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Day at the Park Picnic on Saturday, September 8, 2007 from 12 pm to 5 pm. There will be music, entertainment and free health and dental screenings.
