

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD SEPTEMBER 25, 2007.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:05 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Pastor Becker from Trinity Lutheran Church gave the evening's invocation. Alex Cardenas, Principal of Trinity Lutheran School, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilmember Lambert presented a Proclamation acknowledging and thanking Trinity Lutheran School for 60 years of educating Hawthorne's youth.

Ronald Bowden, representing the Hawthorne Rotarian Club, announced that Mayor Guidi will be the honorary all-star captain for their upcoming baseball clinic. The clinic will be held on October 6th from 9am to 4pm at Holly Park, 2058 W. 120th Street and is geared to boys and girls ages 6 to 14. A sports equipment drive is currently in progress with a drop-off at City Hall, the Rotary Club, the South Bay Workforce Investment Board and the Inglewood One Stop Center.

Mayor Guidi presented a short video highlighting the ceremony held at City Hall honoring the heroes of 9/11.

Announced that the City of Hawthorne and the Beach Cities League of Women Voters will cosponsor a candidate's night election forum on October 15th from 7pm to 9pm at the Hawthorne Memorial Center. As part of "National Make a Difference Day", on Saturday, October 27th, the City of Hawthorne will be planting 65 California Sycamore trees along Rosecrans Avenue, between Prairie and Crenshaw Blvd. Anyone interested in volunteering for this event should call Doug Krause at 310-349-2987. A baseball clinic will be held at Holly Park on October 6th. St. Joseph's Fiesta will be held from Friday, September 28 until Sunday, September 30, 2007. Thanked Lisa Miller and her staff and Lily Craig for their efforts to beautify the corner of Imperial and Hawthorne Blvd. The flying wing monument at 120th and Crenshaw has been rebuilt. Thanked all the citizens that have invested and continue to believe in the City.

Councilmember **Catano** reiterated that the Council is here to make sure that our city is being well run and that it looks that best that it can and they rely on the public to tell them about problems in the city. Attended the Holly Park Barbeque.

Councilmember **Parsons** suggested having a christening event for the helicopter. Inquired on forming a Police Foundation with the Chamber of Commerce. The City Manager replied that the Chamber President is looking into it. Inquired on steam cleaning the sidewalks. Plans are being made so that trash collection days will be changed in most neighborhoods so that they are the same as street sweeping days. A crossing gate will be put in at Inglewood by the railroad tracks just north of the post office. Quantas Airlines, who

has been flying over homes and waking residents at one, two and three in the morning, now wants to expand at LAX. Feels that it is really important that residents have the right to criticize their government.

Councilmember **Lambert** thanked Mr. Gutierrez for the Holly Park picnic. Attended the Cuban Festival and the VFW breakfast. Thursday, October 18th is the Community BBQ Dinner for the Benefit of Holiday Assistance Programs. There will be a Career Job Resource Fair on November 13th at the Long Beach Convention Center. Invited everyone to the Del Aire Church opening of their new sanctuary at 119th and Felton at 10am on October 7th.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked Jose for the Holly Park event and the Balboas for the Cuban Festival. Stated that businesses in the city believe in the community and its leadership and they are always willing to do for the community. Hopes that everybody in the campaign race plays the game fair. Encouraged everybody to vote.

City Clerk **English** reminded everyone that if they have not registered to vote, applications available in the City Clerk's office. Announced that National School Lunch week is from October 15th through the 19th. Assemblyman Curren Price will be hosting a business breakfast on October 1st from 7:30am to 9:30am. Under oral communications, **Joseph and Rachel Fuerstinger** thanked everyone for the generosity and support that enabled them to raise funds so they could participate in the People to People Friendship Games in Holland. **Gordon Meego** gave suggestions on ideas for building an upscale shopping center at the former Hawthorne Mall. **Stephanye Bolton**, Lawndale Council PTA President, requested that the Council proclaim October as PTA Membership Sign up Month. **Alex Vargas**, 11974 York Ave., feels the Hawthorne mall project would push us further down the road to the city's demise. Asked that the City Council members to vote against the Hawthorne Mall housing project and the Prestige Villa housing project. **Lesia Davis**, 12507 Yukon Ave., reported that commercial vehicles are using streets in her neighborhood for parking. Sometimes they sit there for hours at a time with engines running which causes pollution. **David Hull** also reported on commercial vehicles that sit in the streets with their engines running. **Ronnie Manson** reported on congestion at Eucalyptus Park and that the red curbing is being ignored due to fading. **Margaret Jeppesen**, President of Friends of the Library, announced that they will be having a used book and bake sale for the Hawthorne and Wiseburn libraries on October 13th from 9am to 3pm.
