

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD FEBRUARY 26, 2008.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:10 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Pastor Martir from St. George's Episcopal Church gave the evening's invocation. Girl Scout Troop # 774 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Merit to Girl Scout Troop #774 for their service to the community as the Color Guard at tonight's meeting.

Mayor Guidi introduced Katie Holmes, Community Development Manager of the American Cancer Society, who announced the times and dates for the Relay for Life event where they will be honoring cancer survivors and collecting money for a great cause. **Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:**

Councilmember **Catano** along with the Lions, Rotarians and Kiwanians met with the Principal of Leuzinger High School where \$2500 was donated towards a program to keep kids in school. Attended a breakfast sponsored by the Lions and Behavioral Health Services where \$1000 was raised. Half the money will go to the Lions for their Low Vision Program. Attended a meeting for the "Relay for Life" event. Announced that Assemblyman Price will hold an "All About Business" event on Friday at Hollywood Park. Announced that there will be two bills on the June 8<sup>th</sup> ballot regarding eminent domain.

Councilmember **Parsons** thanked the City Manager for the report on the police helicopter. Stated that on the propositions regarding eminent domain, there is one put on by special interest and one by cities, so read up on them carefully. Inquired on the Quimby report that he had previously asked for.

Councilmember **Juarez** congratulated the Chamber of Commerce for a successful State of the City. Attended the Jet Art event at the Hawthorne Airport. Attended Carson's 40<sup>th</sup> Birthday Party. Attended the Promenade of Prominence Induction for Congresswoman Diane Watson. Attended the Hollyglen Homeowners Association and thanked Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr, Sgt. Chris Cognac and PSO Kathleen Burnett for coming to speak at the meeting. Announced that a 12-week long Citizen's Academy will begin on March 27<sup>th</sup> through June 19<sup>th</sup> and is limited to 25 applicants. For information, call Sgt. Congratulated Hawthorne swim team, the Stingrays, for taking first place at a recent swim meet. Congratulated new HMEA President Mari Guerrero and officers Kathy Burnett, Mark Lindbergh, Holly Peck, Chris Burrus, Dennis Hernandez and Jimmy Carradine. Congratulated Rick and Carol DeVusser on renewing their vows. Attended the Lions breakfast. Inquired on the parking situation at Academy Insurance. Announced that volunteers are needed for the SBWIB Youth Job Fair on April 17<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 1pm. Announced that the City is putting on a Bunny Breakfast on March 15<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 11am at the Hawthorne Memorial Center. Announced that the Parks & Rec. Stated that there is a problem with weeds and loud music at the laundromat at 133<sup>rd</sup> and Hawthorne Blvd. Requested a report on the distance allowed that pedophiles can live near parks and schools. Asked the community to come together with a proposal to reopen RFK Hospital. Announced that the façade on Hawthorne Blvd. between 129<sup>th</sup> and El Segundo is finally finished. Thanked Code Enforcement for cleaning up the area near 118<sup>th</sup> and Doty.

Under oral communications **Jose Gutierrez** of the Holly Park Homeowner's Association reminded the community that the neighborhood watch multi group meeting that was previously scheduled for February 27<sup>th</sup> has been rescheduled to March 1<sup>st</sup> from 9:30am to 11am at the Hawthorne Police Department Community Room. **Doris Martinez**, 11982 S. Truro Ave., reported that there is a problem with drugs at Eucalyptus Park. **Ronnie Manson** announced that the Hawthorne High School Drum and Bugle Corps will be starting their winter season. They took 1<sup>st</sup> place at their first competition at Claremont High School. They will also perform at Artesia High School on March 1<sup>st</sup> and at Disneyland. **Minerva Soba**, 11963 Acacia, asked for assistance after being denied a permit to add a driveway. **Allen Richards**, 13828 Ramona Ave., on behalf of the Ramona Homeowner's Association, thanked Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr for cleaning up the sidewalks on the westside of Hawthorne Blvd. from El Segundo south and for installing the street signs at Grevillea and El Segundo Blvd. Invited Council and staff to a public meeting of the Ramona Neighborhood Association on March 6<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at Ramona School. **Monica Simon** proposed a plaque or red ribbon event to bring attention to the problem of drugs in the parks.

#### **Under Discussion/Action Items:**

- Term Limits (Parsons)

Councilmember Parsons would like to consider putting term limits to the voters on the November ballot. After talking to people during last November's campaign, it was determined that one of the issues they had was that they would like to have a chance to vote on term limits. Most South Bay cities have some form of term limits and most cities in LA County have adopted term limits. The State has adopted term limits and when the State tried to change the term limits, almost in every case the voters said not to touch the term limits because they liked them the way they were. Term limits would allow new people and new ideas to come to the city.

Councilmember Parsons moved, seconded by Councilmember Juarez, to direct staff to come back with a survey of general law cities in LA County, a summary of what type of term limits they have and bring back that report to the Council.
