

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD MARCH 11, 2008.**

Mayor Pro Tem Lambert called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:10 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Patricia Donaldson from Olivet Lutheran Church gave the evening's invocation. Councilmember Catano led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilmember Catano presented a Certificate of Recognition to Yvette Johnson-Reagan for being honored as Woman of the Year in the 25th Senatorial District.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Juarez** attended Assemblyman Price's Big All-About-Business event, Opening Day for the Wiseburn National Little League, the City of Hawthorne Community Action Committee, the Ramona Neighborhood Association meeting, the Subway grand opening and the 2008 Centinela Youth Services Volunteer Recognition banquet. Inquired if the clean water fee question and answer sheet would be on the website and stated that if anyone needs clarification regarding the water fees, to contact Arnie Shadbehr. Received a letter from Peace Over Violence to pass a resolution for Denim Day in LA 2008. Announced that Jan Vogel, Executive Director for the SBWIB was able to secure major funding for the South Bay WIB Bridge to Work program. Inquired if the City had a program that could be submitted to get the SCAG 2nd Annual Compass Blue Print Recognition award. Stated that the City website now has a link on the agenda that will lead you to staff reports and supporting documentation. Asked for clarification regarding the Quimby act and new development. Asked that narrative be provided for the General Fund Revenue sheet. Thanked Chief Heffner for the report on sex registration program in California and asked that it be put on the website. Pointed out that Mark Ridley Thomas is the only candidate for the Supervisor seat who has made health care the number one issue. Announced that tomorrow is the grand opening for Walgreen's on 120th and Hawthorne Blvd. at 11:30am. The Bunny Breakfast and Opening Day for Holly Park Little League will be held on Saturday. Congratulated Yvette Johnson on her Woman of the Year award.

Councilmember **Parsons** asked for a report on how the funds received from the California Gang Reduction Intervention Prevention Grant will be spent. Commended Lisa Miller for the memo on the pros and cons of establishing health districts. Stated that A. T. & T. may soon be offering TV service in Hawthorne. Would like to see the Caltrans property on Doty & 118th be turned over to a non-profit to make a pocket park. Inquired on what ever happened with the water brooms. Reported that the agenda is now online along with backup reports. Inquired if the state is delaying or taking any monies from the City. Requested a report from staff to see if we should have an ordinance that implements the Quimby Act. Suggested getting cameras for Hawthorne Blvd. businesses to catch vandals.
