

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD MAY 13, 2008.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:10 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Juarez, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: None.

Patricia Feldman from Olivet Lutheran Church gave the evening's invocation. Zack led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The public drawing for fireworks stands was held. Out of 11 applicants, the following eight were chosen by random drawing: Hope is Helping, Jim Thorpe Little League, California Youth Karate Club, Hawthorne Parks and Recreation Foundation, Moneta Gardens Improvement, Hawthorne Moose Lodge, South Bay Celebration Assembly of God and Hawthorne Lions. The three alternates are Kiwanis Club of Hawthorne, Hawthorne High School Band and St. Joseph's School.

Congressional Aide Tiayanna Mendoza from Congresswoman Maxine Water's office announced that a Foreclosure Prevention and Homeownership Assistance Town Hall meeting will be held on Saturday, May 17<sup>th</sup> at Inglewood High School from 10am to 12pm. There will be on site credit counseling for anyone who feels they are in risk of foreclosure.

Hawthorne Cable TV employee Josh Robbins announced that he is planning a trip that involves traveling to all 30 major league baseball stadiums. His goal is to raise \$10,000 and give half of it back to the community. Jim Thorpe Little League was chosen to receive these funds.

Mayor Guidi announced that May 12th to May 17th is Blue Ribbon Week in support of law enforcement.

A clip from last year's Children Safety Awareness Day was shown. The 2008 event will be held on May 17<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am.

Councilmember **Parsons** attended the Richstone Center Pier to Pier Walk. Inquired on how process to pay tickets online is coming along; the City Manager replied that it is now possible to pay tickets online by going to the City's website. Rep. Inquired on the status of the swimming pool; the City Manager replied that the project is on schedule and should be completed by mid July. Inquired if a Hawthorne officer is doing something outside of Hawthorne on City business and they need the helicopter to help them, if that is allowed under policy; Chief Heffner replied that it is allowed. Reported that longtime Hawthorne business H&C has filed for Chapter 7. Announced that Superintendent Dr. Brann of the Wiseburn School District is retiring this month; Tom Johnstone will be the new Superintendent. Spoke on Propositions 98 & 99 regarding eminent domain. Announced that there will be a public budget workshop on May 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6pm in City Hall.

Councilmember **Lambert** attended the volunteer ceremony, Rock Around the Block and the cancer walk at the high school. Thanked those who participated in Earth Day. Congratulated the Richstone Center for doing extremely well.

Councilmember **Juarez** attended Rock Around the Block, National Prayer Day at City Hall, the Islamic Center Health Fair, the Behavioral Health Services graduation, Volunteer Appreciation, the Rotary Club and El Camino Foundation honors Cora Travers, the Delmer L. Fox Humanitarian Awards, the Medal of Valor and the Northrop KC45 Tanker celebration. Congratulated Elon Musk of SpaceX for winning the Falcon Launch Vehicle contract. Announced that the RFP for the old police station site went out and is due on June 12<sup>th</sup> in the City Clerk's office by 4pm. Reported that progress is being made on the west side of Hawthorne Blvd. with the construction of protective parking bays. Received a report regarding fees that were not collected for the rental of the Memorial Center. Announced that this Sunday, Assemblyman Price will honor the 51<sup>st</sup> Assembly District Shero honorees, which include Mary Coleman, Isabel Brettner, Rosalinda Martinez, Nadia Barrera, Herminia Balboa, Margaret Jeppeson, Darlene Love and Viviana Franco. The opening of the Del Aire Farmer's Market will be held on May 21<sup>st</sup> at Del Aire Park from 3pm to 7pm.

Councilmember **Catano** attended the Northrop celebration, the Del Fox Awards, the Medal of Valor, Day of Prayer and the BHS graduation.

Mayor **Guidi** brought to the community's attention that we are headed for a severe recession. The governor will announce tomorrow that the state is in a \$20million deficit that will affect the City. We need to stop balancing our budget with one time money and find a way to reduce spending, cost and expenses. Asked that Council not vote against a development because they don't like the developer. Asked for a report on what is being generated by business license because of the Hawthorne Airport. Thanked the building inspectors, along with Public Works and Planning departments for the good job they do working with new developers. Inquired on some trees that were lost at Memorial Park. Suggested we start replenishing trees in parks because a lot of them are not doing well. Asked that the Doty issue between El Segundo and 132<sup>nd</sup> be continuously monitored and that the parks be patrolled.

City Clerk **English** announced that the Lawndale Chamber of Commerce was here earlier and wanted to invite the Mayor and Council to their Farmer's Market, which is now held on Wednesdays from 2pm to 7pm at 147<sup>th</sup> St. and Hawthorne Blvd.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked all the organizations for the events he attended. Stated that the boulevard looks great and is really coming along.
