

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD JUNE 24, 2008.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:10 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Juarez, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: Councilmember Catano (excused).

Pastor George Magdalany from Hope Chapel gave the evening's invocation. Girl Scout Troop #774 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Merit to Girl Scout Troop #774 for their service to the community as the Color Guard at the June 24, 2008 City Council meeting.

Mayor Guidi presented a video promoting Hawthorne and businesses.

Mayor Pro Tem Lambert presented a Proclamation to Detectives Sean Galindo and Eric Lane in recognition of their outstanding service in the investigation into the death of two-year old Kayla Smoot. Another Proclamation was also given to Detective Eric Lane in honor of being chosen as Police Officer of the Year.

Under oral communications, **Max Jimenez** expressed his complements to the city on the project at 120th and Broadway. **Hamid Haque** commended the great work being done on the Hawthorne Boulevard renovation and on the parking improvements near his Shafraa restaurant. **Alex Monteiro** presented a plaque to the City for its involvement in the Relay for Life event held in April. Also presented certificates to the City hall staff team, the Public Works department maintenance staff and Rick Carver, Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr, the Police Department, Police Chief Mike Heffner, the South Bay Investment Board team and Danny Juarez from the Youth Soccer Organization. **Patricia Donaldson**, President of the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce, applauded the Mayor, Rick Carver and the Public Works department for the work they have done on Hawthorne Boulevard. **Rick DeVusser**, 1654 W. 145th S., spoke on how much he and his wife enjoyed the Italian festival. **Bill Hassan** thanked everyone who has participated in the renovation of Hawthorne Boulevard by 120th Street as it has impacted his business in a positive way. **David LaSalle**, Chamber Board Member, commended everyone who participated in the improvement of Hawthorne Boulevard; it is a job well done. **Darlene Love**, 2003 W. 115th Street, expressed thanks for the beautiful boulevard, but was hurt that an article in the local paper portrayed the boulevard in a negative way. Enjoyed the Italian Festival. Thanked everyone who attended when she was given the honor of the citizen. **Ronny Manson** reported that visitors to Eucalyptus Park feel much safer now due to increased police presence. **Francis Stiglich** reported on traffic problems between Eucalyptus and Gale Ave. and on illegal food vendors. Also reported on two manhole covers on Eucalyptus that are not cemented down. Inquired on the health of Councilmember Catano.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Discussion/Action Items:

1) City Manager's Recommendations for Balancing 2008/09 Budget: (City Council)

- Use of one-time revenue to balance general fund;
One time monies that could be used for the proposed budget would include a \$500,000 transfer from the equipment fund, a \$700,000 transfer from the Proposition C Fund for police and graffiti removal activity and \$300,000 from the COPS Allocation Fund to support the police department.
- Elimination of vacant positions, including 3 vacant police officer positions;

Councilmember Juarez opposes eliminating police officer positions and suggested laterals from other departments and more aggressive advertising. Mayor Guidi stated that if we have money for three more cops or we want to cut three more cops, he would rather give a bonus to the officers that are here to let them know we appreciate them for being here and staying here.

- Staff lay offs / early retirement incentives

The savings that would have come from early retirement incentives only generated four people.

- Retiree payouts being charged to reserves

Police department employees who are retiring would need \$200,000 payoff their unused leave balances. It is recommended that this would come from reserve.

- 1) Earthquake Insurance (Lambert)
- 2) Police service calls to city parks (Juarez)

Mayor **Guidi** thanked all the volunteers, community groups and business owners that participated in the Italian Festival; Ronny Manson for helping out overnight with security; Rosalinda Martinez, Monica McClanahan and all the city employees that supported the event by donating their own time. Attended the LA Airforce Base Awards. Congratulated Darlene Love on her well-deserved award. Encouraged everyone to go to Equinox, which officially opened on Friday. Announced that five major corporations will be coming to Hawthorne. Reported changes and improvements at Eucalyptus and Thorpe parks. Inquired on the status of the pool at the youth camp. Requested a Jack Northrop Hawthorne Airport sign on the 405 somewhere between Imperial and El Segundo. Announced that the Teen Challenge Car Show will be held on July 12th. All homeowner's associations and non-profits are welcome. Asked that we keep Councilmember Catano in our prayers.

Councilmember **Juarez** congratulated Angie English for the successful Southern California City Clerk 's Association meeting that she hosted last week. Thanked the department heads that donated goodies to showcase the city for this event. Attended the Italian Festival. Congratulated Darlene Love for her Citizen of the Year award and Candy Fuller for receiving the Ned Chafee award. Inquired on where we are with the Memorial rental fees. Inquired if we submitted anything for "Most Business Friendly City in LA County". Asked that we try to conserve water as we are in a drought. Inquired if the city had submitted their project list for Prop.1B allocations. Read that Republic Services had bought Allied Waste and inquired what effect that would have on us. Announced that on Thursday Assemblymember Curren Price will be having the Committee for a Better 51 Assembly District and there are seven subcommittees that will be reporting (Councilmember Juarez belonging to the Health Committee) and it will be from 6 to 8 in the community room at Inglewood City Hall. On Friday the Hospital Association of Southern California will be hosting a health care summit for Los Angeles County, which will give citizens an opportunity to raise their concerns; it will be held at the Biltmore Hotel. The Islamic Center will be holding a yard sale this Saturday. The Hawthorne Education Foundation Golf Tournament will be held next Monday at Chester Washington from 1pm to 7pm. Vasek Polak Health Clinic now has classes for Diabetes on Thursdays. Congratulated his son Vincent on graduating from High School. Announced that he would not be here for the next Council meeting.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on the progress of the monument sign advertising businesses at Inglewood and 147th St. Inquired if there is a plan on how the Prop 1B funds will be spent. Due to concerns about overtime, asked for a monthly report by department. Asked for a monthly status report on police officer interviews, how many in the academy and how many on probation. Attended League of California Cities training classes for councilmembers, which was paid at his own expense. Classes included Economic Development, City Manager Evaluation, Preparing for a Ballot Measure and City Finance.

Councilmember **Lambert** congratulated Darlene Love on her award. Will be attending Lawndale's State of the City tomorrow and encouraged others to also attend. Would like to hold a presentation on earthquake preparedness before November 13th as this is the date when a practice drill for earthquake survival will be held. Encouraged everyone to visit www.shakeout.org and www.daretoprepare.org for earthquake information.

City Treasurer Lubenec attended the Italian Festival. Congratulated Darlene Love on her award.
