

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD JULY 22, 2008.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:10 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Juarez, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: Councilmember Catano (excused).

Patricia Feldman from Olivet Lutheran Church gave the evening's invocation. Pastor Phil Cookes led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi presented videos on the 2nd Annual Italian Festival and the Teen Challenge/Mayor Guidi Car Show.

Mayor Guidi introduced His Royal Highness Igwe Orizu III of Nnewi, Nigeria who is visiting the City of Hawthorne to see about the possibility of sister city hood. A Proclamation honoring HRH was also presented. Pat Donaldson from the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce also presented a plaque to HRH.

Mayor Guidi wished Councilmember Lambert a Happy Birthday and invited everyone to the lobby for cake in her honor.

1.

Under oral communications **Alex Monteiro** spoke on the fees being charged to non-profits who do events at city parks. **Phil Cookes** thanked the City and the Council for their involvement in the Teen Challenge Car Show. Asked to consider passing the Ordinance on tonight's agenda regarding reduced fees for non-profit groups. **Barbara Johnson**, Manager of Wiseburn Library, asked for everyone's support to stop the state senate from looking at local money to balance the state budget as this would affect city government, county government and it would directly affect the library. **Darlene Love** inquired on who owns the land at the end of Holly Park as it needs to be cleaned. Thanked Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr for doing a nice job when things need to be done on the streets of Holly Park. **Nicholas Williams** requested four-way stop signs at Truro and 118th. **Debra White** spoke on an incident involving her son's arrest and asked that the arrest be abolished from his record if the findings are all false. **Karen Green** asked for help regarding problems at her apartment complex. **Anthony Tolliver, Michael Melon, Harim Vargas, Brianna, Kristy and Cindy** all spoke on the positive effect Teen Challenge has had on their lives and asked that the City support Teen Challenge. **Viviana Franco**, Executive Director of Lot to Spot, spoke on the park that they are trying to build at 118th & Doty. **Antoinette Pierce** asked that Council reconsider imposing fees on programs like Teen Challenge. **Francis Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., reported on trash problems in her neighborhood and people taking recyclables out of the collection bins.

2.

Mayor Guidi recessed the City Council meeting to conduct a **Closed Session**: Conference with Labor Negotiator pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.6. Agency Negotiator: Jag Pathirana - Employee Organization: Hawthorne Police Officers' Association.

Mayor Guidi called the City Council meeting back to order following recess with all Councilmembers present except for Councilmember Catano who was excused. He announced that the **closed session** was to discuss a Conference with Labor Negotiator pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.6. Agency Negotiator: Jag Pathirana - Employee Organizations: Hawthorne Police Officers' Association and announced that Labor Negotiator was directed and that staff has been advised.

3.

Discussion/Action items:

- **Support of SB1420**

Councilmember **Lambert** discussed supporting SB1420, which would require restaurants to put a nutritional value on everything they serve.

Councilmember Parsons and Councilmember Juarez support SB1420 and requested a Resolution be brought back to the next meeting.

- **Water Conservation**

Due to the raising of taxes and money cuts by the Governor, Mayor Guidi wants to make sure we have a water conservation program in place.

- Pocket Park at 118th Street: Future city maintenance of the park

Councilmember Juarez explained the three phases of the park, which are acquisition, construction and maintenance. Maintenance being one of the stickling points as to why the city could not participate has now been taken care of by the Los Angeles Conservation Corp. They would support the maintenance of the park for an indefinite time. Councilmember Juarez suggested that after the park is in place for five years, then the City could take over the maintenance of the park.

Mayor moved, seconded by Councilmember Lambert, to **table** this item because he wants more information from staff.

After some discussion Councilmember Juarez moved, seconded by Councilmember Parsons that the City provides maintenance after five years of existence at the pocket park at 118th Street and Doty, contingent upon the organization getting guarantees that they'll get the \$300,000 for the purchase of the property.

Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember Lambert would like to work with the South Bay COG Energy conservation Board to see if they would give us a break on the purchase of tankless water conservation tanks for homes if we bought them in quantities.

Councilmember Juarez thanked the creators of “One Person’s Trash” for putting some items in Spanish. Received a copy of the new city atlas and suggested it be put on the city website. Asked that letters of

congratulations be sent to the five companies in the City that were given Certificates of Recognition by the Los Angeles County Sanitation District. Wants to put together a 5-year strategic plan. Would like a financial statement on the fireworks sales.

Mayor Guidi moved, seconded by Councilmember Lambert, to write a letter of support so that the hip-hop school can continue its charter.

- Earthquake Insurance

Councilmember Lambert would like Council and the City to consider whether or not to purchase earthquake coverage for our major buildings. Explained that there is no insurance company that will give you more than \$125 million for any incident, but it is in pools. If we joined a pool with other cities, we may get very little money for unknown damage. Proposed that we buy a \$10 million policy for \$65,000 on our own, the difference being that we would get the \$10 million. Other options include a \$20 million policy at \$97,500 and a \$30 million policy at \$122,500. Requested that this item come back on the next agenda.

The Certification of Compliance with Government Code Section 20903.

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council adopt the Certification of Compliance with Government Code Section 20903 and elect to provide the benefits of Government Code 20903 to all eligible members who retire within the designated period.

Mayor Guidi called Harold Roth for a brief presentation. Mr. Roth said that currently the city's ordinance does not require front yards to be maintained in residential areas. Basically this Ordinance is to require front yards to be maintained, landscaped and irrigated. He stated that under "fix the broken window" concept, Code Enforcement will be allowed to remedy small problems from forming and encourage continued investment and maintenance within the neighborhood.

Mayor Guidi called for public comments.

Under oral communications, Jose Gutierrez, 2526 W. 118th Pl., asked for clarification on what the process and fees will be for those neighbors who's properties need maintenance.

Mayor Guidi ordered the public portion of the hearing closed.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA APPROVING A CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION UNDER CEQA AND AMENDING TITLE 17 (ZONING) OF THE HAWTHORNE MUNICIPAL CODE, SECTION 17.20.090 RECREATIONAL OPEN SPACE, SECTION 17.20.100 LANDSCAPING, AND MAKING FINDINGS IN SUPPORT THEREOF.

Ordinance No. 1932 was introduced by title only by Mayor Guidi.

City Clerk Angie English announced that this was the time and place to hold the public hearing on Ordinance No. 1933, - Zoning Code Amendment No. 2008ZA07 amending Chapter 17.04 [Definitions], amending Section 17.20.160 [Accessory buildings, structures and uses], Adding Section 17.20.280 [Containers], amending Section 17.25.030 [Limitations on permitted uses], amending Section 17.26.030 [Limitations on Permitted uses], amending Section 17.28.030 [Limitations on Permitted uses], amending Section 17.30.020(68) [Permitted uses], amending Section 17.32.020(41) [Permitted uses], adding Section 17.32.020(44) [Permitted uses], amending Section 17.34.020(48) [Permitted uses], adding Section 17.34.020(52) [Permitted uses], and adding Section 17.34.020(53) [Permitted uses].

Planning Department's Declaration filed. No written communications were received. Call for oral comments. Motion to close hearing. Motion to Introduce Ordinance No. 1933.

Mayor Guidi called Harold Roth for a brief presentation. He said that canopies are currently not addressed in the zoning ordinance. The proposed ordinance will limit the use of canopies in residential zones to the rear yard and prohibit canopies on driveways and in setback areas. In commercial and industrial zones, canopies will be limited to covering walkways.

The proposed ordinance will restrict containers in residential zones to two one-week intervals per calendar year. The intention here is to accommodate storage "pods" and similar storage options that are becoming increasingly commonplace. The keeping of a shipping container on a permanent basis, such as an 8 foot by 10 foot model used as a tool shed, would be prohibited by this ordinance. In commercial zones and in the M-P and M-1 zones, containers are prohibited altogether by this ordinance. Containers will be permitted in the M-2, but not permitted to be stacked.

Mayor Guidi called for public comments.

Under oral comments, no one indicated a desire to be heard.

Mayor Guidi ordered the public portion of the hearing closed.

Councilmember Parsons requested a one-week extension with the approval of the Planning Department.
