

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD AUGUST 26, 2008.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:03 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Juarez, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: Councilmember Catano (excused).

Rev. Tracy McKibben gave the evening's invocation. Francis Stiglich led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce President Pat Donaldson introduced new Chamber member Beatrice Williams.

Under oral communications **Michael Ledesma**, 3227 W. 132<sup>nd</sup> St., who is a real estate investor, has joined forces with St. Margaret's Center in order to provide a financial literacy program that will be free to the community. Classes are scheduled for the beginning of October at St. Margaret's Center from 4pm to 5pm. **Steve Kosareff**, who is doing a TV documentary, requested photos or movies of Mr. Lloyd Denee, who was a prominent TV dealer in Hawthorne from 1946 to 1956. York Ave., spoke on the North Hawthorne Community Association. This is a group of residents that have decided to take action in changing the future of their section of Hawthorne. The NHCA is north of El Segundo Blvd., bordered by Crenshaw on the east, Imperial on the north and Inglewood Ave. on the west. Some of their concerns are gangs, graffiti and high-density housing. On behalf of the NHCA, thanked Police Chief Michael Heffner, Councilman Gary Parsons, Licensing and Code Enforcement Director Lisa Miller, Code Enforcement Officer Don Krause, Sgt. Romero, City Manager Jag Pathirana and Councilman Danny Juarez for the help they have provided to the association. The NHCA meets on the first Monday of the month except for September when they will meet on the second Monday. **Darlene Love**, 2003 W. 116<sup>th</sup> St., thanked everyone that attended the Holly Park Homeowners Association picnic. **Francis Stiglich**, 11534 Gale Ave., encouraged her neighbors to attend the September 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of the North Hawthorne Community Association.

Mayor Guidi recessed the City Council meeting to conduct a **Closed Session**: Conference with Labor Negotiator pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.6. Agency Negotiator: Jag Pathirana - Employee Organization: All Employee Groups.

Mayor Guidi called the City Council meeting back to order following recess with all Councilmembers present except for Councilmember Catano who was excused. He announced that the **closed session** was to discuss a Conference with Labor Negotiator pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.6. Agency Negotiator: Jag Pathirana - Employee Organization: All Employee Groups and announced that the Agency Negotiator was instructed.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

**Discussion/Action Items:**

- Customer service issues with respect to Allied Waste (Parsons)

Councilman **Parsons** stated that although problems were anticipated with the transition from H&C to Allied Waste, he still continues to get phone calls regarding different issues such as long hold times, not being able to resolve simple problems when customers call for help and missed streets. Would like to enforce the part of the contract that has financial penalties for violating quality concerns. Directed staff from this point forward that if Allied fails to meet those quality standards, that the penalty per the contract be implemented.

- Moving closed sessions to a different night or at the end of regular council meeting (Parsons)

Since closed sessions usually don't last more than an hour, Councilmember Parsons would like to hold closed sessions at 5 o'clock so that they are over by 6 o'clock and that way people who come to the meetings don't have to wait around for an hour. Recommended that council meetings start at 5 o'clock on days where there is a closed session and at 6 o'clock on days when there is no closed session. Councilmember Juarez supported this. Councilmember Lambert asked to think about it. Councilmember Parsons asked that it be re-agendized it for the next council meeting.

- Hawthorne Youth Camp (Pathirana)

City Manager Pathirana asked for direction on what to do with the youth camp in Wrightwood. He stated that it has minimal use and that general funds subsidize the program by \$80,000 to \$100,000 a year. A number of organizations have shown interest in taking over the place.

Councilmember Lambert moved, seconded by Councilmember Juarez, to begin to sever links with the youth camp in Wrightwood.

Councilmember **Juarez** congratulated the Hawthorne and Wiseburn School Districts on their STAR exam scores, which went up in both areas. Requested a report on when the Teen Center will be opening. Thanked Housing Director Hamid Pournamdari for the informative report on SB1137 and requested that the report be put on the city website. Asked that the proposal for the Strategic Plan be agendized for the next meeting. Requested that the City Manager take a look at the ordinance that the City of Glendale has regarding shopping carts. Attended Jim Wilson's retirement party and requested that the city manager prepare a proclamation.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that there will be two speakers addressing the earthquake situation on September 13<sup>th</sup> from 10 am to 12pm. Asked that the Homeowner Associations be notified of this event. Congratulated Officer Steve Romero for creating the Citizens of Hawthorne Action Team (CHAT).

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on why the County can fine taggers for graffiti and the city cannot. Asked for a report on this issue. For those facing financial hard times and looking at foreclosure of their homes, there is a state law that basically says your mortgage company cannot take any foreclosure action against you for at least 30 days after contacting you. This only applies if you bought your home between January 1, 2003 and December 31, 2007 and you have to live in your house. Announced that Assembly man Curren Price will hold a function on September 18<sup>th</sup> on how 501C3 non profits can raise funds. Anyone who needs more information regarding the new North Hawthorne homeowner group can contact Councilmember Parsons.

Mayor/Chairman Guidi recessed the Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to conduct the meeting of the City Council.
