

**MINUTES OF A SPECIAL AND REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD NOVEMBER 25, 2008.**

Mayor/Chairman Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority, Housing Authority meeting and special meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:10 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Juarez, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.
Absent: Councilmember Catano (excused)

Al Richards gave the evening's invocation. Walt Dixon led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Guidi called the items on the special agenda as the first items of business

Mayor Guidi called for oral communication on the special meeting agenda and no one expressed a desire to be heard.

2.

Mayor Guidi recessed the City Council meeting to conduct a **Closed Session**: Conference with Legal Counsel – Existing Litigation (Subdivision (a)) of Section 54956.9 of the California Government Code. Name of Case: Anthony & Karla Goodrow v. City of Hawthorne, et al., Case No: CV 07-5253 VBF (PJWx)

Mayor Guidi called the City Council meeting back to order following recess with all Councilmembers present except for Councilmember Catano who was excused. He announced that the **closed session** was to discuss a Conference with Legal Counsel – Existing Litigation (Subdivision (a)) of Section 54956.9 of the California Government Code. Name of Case: Anthony & Karla Goodrow v. City of Hawthorne, et al., Case No: CV 07-5253 VBF (PJWx). The City Attorney, Glen Shishido announced that it was going to be an action to settle the Goodrow vs. City of Hawthorne case which is the next item on the special meeting agenda.

3.

A settlement has been proposed in the case entitled Anthony & Karla Goodrow v. City of Hawthorne, et al, (CV-07-5253 VBF (PJWx)). Under the settlement, the City would pay \$175,000.00 and the ICRMA would pay the balance of the proposed settlement.

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council authorize the settlement of the Anthony & Karla Goodrow lawsuit in the amount of \$175,000 and that the Finance Director release the settlement draft c/o City Attorney's Office to Plaintiff Karla & Anthony Goodrow and Jonas & Driscoll L.L.P. within seven days after the settlement agreement is signed by all parties.

Regular Council meeting.

1.

Under oral communications, **Alex Monteiro** thanked everyone who has been helping the Hawthorne Presidents Council deliver food baskets to needy families for Thanksgiving and to all the organizations in the community who donated turkeys, food and money. He announced that there will be a Relay for Life meeting on December 1st at the Moose Lodge at 6pm., with the goal of raising \$60,000 and creating 40 teams. The event will be held on April 4th and 5th. He stated that Moneta Garden Improvement Assn has partnered with the City on the Echo Housing issue. He said that Echo housing, which provides housing to the seniors and disabled, is a good idea, but is merely a band aid attempt to fix the ongoing housing shortage problem. He concluded that it would be better for the City to purchase excess housing in the neighborhood rather than to rely on the Echo Housing proposal. **Allen Richards**, 13828 Ramona Ave., feels it would be costly to put ECHO housing in backyards as most driveways are not accessible to put

something that large down the driveway into the backyard. Inquired on whether it is true that the owner of the former Hawthorne Mall wants to build 410 apartments on top of the parking structure or build a Wal-Mart. **Ronny Manson** reported on the health issues of Ann Hansen from the VFW. **Helen Goban** asked for assistance regarding housing issues. **Alex Vargas** stated that members of the North Hawthorne Community Association are concerned with regards to the purchase of the properties on Gale Avenue for which the redevelopment funds are going to be used because it reinforces the idea that their neighborhood is a low income housing neighborhood. Suggested that housing be made available in all the areas of Hawthorne. Invited all to attend meetings of the NHCA which are held the first Monday of the month at St. Joseph Hall at 7pm. **Ty Williams**, representing DCX, asked if anyone had questions regarding agenda item 18. **Darlene Love** invited Council to the Lions Club Christmas party which will be held at the Moose Lodge on the 13th.

2.

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Discussion/Action Items:

- City assisting the Chamber of Commerce with the 2009 State of the City event (City Manager)

Councilmember Parsons would like to support the Chamber's State of the City and that we allow the City to send out the letter on City stationery, but the Chamber pays for all our printing and mailing costs. City Manager Pathirana asked for 50 hours of staff time in order to help with this event.

Councilmember Parsons moved, seconded by Councilmember Juarez to support the Chamber and send a letter out inviting people to the Chamber State of the City.

- ECHO Housing Project (Lambert)

Councilmember Lambert stated that she cannot conceive in her mind how you can put a little square 500 sq. ft. living conditions behind anyone's houses. Recommends that something better be looked at because 500 feet just isn't living.

Councilmember Juarez moved, seconded by Councilmember Lambert to amend contract to 3 years.

- Mayor **Guidi** requested to hold his items until the December 9th meeting.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that the South Bay Environmental Services Center on Carson Street is holding a Holiday Light Exchange program where you can bring two strands of old energy guzzling holiday lights and exchange them for two strands of LED lights. Asked that the City Manager try to negotiate an agreement with the water company to bring costs down. Thanked Rosalinda Martinez and everyone who worked on the holiday dinner for the seniors. Any one interested in serving on the civil grand jury for the year 2009-2010 should contact Councilmember Lambert for more information. Compensation is \$68 a day. Thanked everyone who participated in Measure V.

Councilmember **Parsons** inquired on what the current sales tax projections are based on. Thanked Councilmember Juarez and staff who volunteered their time to Measure V. Attended functions for Air Force Week in the City of LA and the South Bay Area Chamber of Commerce. Asked for donations of men's suits to help vets returning from Iraq. Is looking to form a closer relationship with the LA Air Force Base and the VFW. Talked with the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce to suggest that once a year a city staff member, Councilmember or board member go out and talk to every business in Hawthorne to see how things are going and to see how we can help to make local businesses more successful. Also suggested that when a new business comes to Hawthorne, a Chamber board member or a Councilmember

go out and shake their hand. Use the State of the City event as an opportunity to get businesses to join the Chamber of Commerce by setting up a table with applications.

Councilmember **Juarez** congratulated Robert O'Brien for being named our Human Resources Manager. Thanked staff for the DVD that was provided regarding city services and suggested that it be sent to the Homeowners groups and the library and that it be put on the City website. Announced that before Yvonne Burke left office, she was able to get the City \$310,000 for the rehabilitation of Holly Park and Memorial Park. Read an article stating that the County pensions may need a \$500,000 bail out and asked if we were in a similar situation. It will take two years before we know for sure. Announced that the City is putting on the 2008 Holiday Home Decorating contest. The judging will be done on December 17th. Reported that the City sponsored vaccine event that was held at the Memorial Center provided 1,106 free flu shots to needy families in the community. Gave input regarding the waiving of fees; fees should be waived when it has to do with seniors and needy families. Attended his first South Bay COG meeting and reported that they are sponsoring a free landscape survey and a green restaurant workshop. Attended the opening of the Lawndale Library, the Seniors Thanksgiving luncheon, the VFW Thanksgiving luncheon and the Hawthorne Teen Center opening. Thanked Chevron, Hawthorne Parks & Recreation Foundation, AYSO Region 21 and US Tow for the money they provided to the Teen Center to help replace items that were stolen. Thanked his good friends at Northrop who as part of "Rebuilding Together South Bay" came to paint and clean the VFW facility in Hawthorne.

City Clerk **English** announced that Assemblyman Price will be holding an open house on December 5th at 4pm to collect toys for needy children throughout the district. The 9-11 Help America Foundation will be sponsoring a "Mariachi Christmas Festival" to support wounded veterans. The event will be held at the Warner Grand Theatre in San Pedro; tickets are \$30.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** gave thanks for the many blessings we have and wished everyone a happy Thanksgiving with their families.

Single family homes are not subject to this other than to use it as resource for people who want to conserve water. It gives something for developers to use as a guide.
