

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD SEPTEMBER 8, 2009.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Pastor Phil Cookes from South Bay Celebration Church gave the evening's invocation. Youth Commissioner Ammar Kahf led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Under oral communications, **Aimee Dudovitz**, 10940 Wilshire Blvd., Suite 2000, LA, attorney with Strumwasser & Woocher representing the Centinela Valley Union High School District, and **Jose Fernandez**, Centinela Valley Superintendent, gave background on what is going on with the Wiseburn unification. Centinela believes that any decision made by the State Board of Education should include giving every citizen in Hawthorne the right to vote on whether succession should go forward or not, that unification would cause Lawndale High (a top 400 performing school in the States) to close and that it would cause taxes in the community to go up greatly. **Patricia Donaldson**, President and CEO of Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce, met with Mayor Guidi and Councilmember Juarez who both assured her that they would run a clean campaign. **Alex Monteiro**, 12413 Ramona Ave., announced that the Lions picnic will be held at Holly Park this Saturday from 11am to 3pm. Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that there will be a ceremony in honor of 9/11 this Friday at 9am at the fire station on Grevillea and El Segundo. Announced that the County Prosecutors Association is going to have a tutorial on the Brown Act on Thursday, October 1st from 10am to 12pm at the Metropolitan Water District boardroom in downtown Los Angeles. This Thursday, September 10th there will be a Census 2010 meeting at 6pm at the Hawthorne Memorial Center. Community leaders will help to get the word out on how important it is to get an accurate count of everybody living in Hawthorne so that we get our fair share of federal money.

Councilmember **Lambert** inquired on the feasibility of chalk marking the parking spots on Hawthorne Blvd. Also asked that an overgrown shrub at 130th and Shoup be looked into as it has already caused a safety issue with two children. Inquired on whether city employees are wearing ID badges while on the job.

Mayor **Guidi** stated that he walked the mall with the mall owner and a potential developer interested in the site. If they were to turn this into a business campus, it is estimated that 4,000 jobs could come to the city. The good news is that right now housing is off the table for the site.

Councilmember **Juarez** attended the Chamber Installation breakfast where the recipients of the Ned Chaffee award and Citizen of the Year were announced. He congratulated Nelson Rios of Advanced Party Rentals, the recipient of the Ned Chaffee award and Bob Marcella who was chosen as Citizen of the Year. Asked for a moment of silence to honor Captain Tedmund Hall and Specialist Arnaldo Quinones, firefighters who gave their lives battling the Station Fire last month. Congratulated Coach Kathy Gore and the seven members of the South Bay Swim Team who recently qualified for the Southern California Junior Olympics. The swim team practices at the Hawthorne City Pool. Asked that residents not dump their over-the-counter and prescription drugs down the drain as this hurts the environment. Instead you can take them to our local CVS, Walgreens or Target where they will properly dispose of them. Reported that the California Highway Patrol and the Hawthorne Police Department have been working together due to a CAL GRIP grant and have made an increase in traffic stops, arrests, citations and vehicle impounds as well as assisting in many incidents. Inquired on whatever became of the memo on the city Youth Commission. Announced that Hawthorne Dentistry and Braces at 13935 Hawthorne Blvd. has received a grant that will provide free braces to children 11 to 18 years old based on income requirements. - Council Members Returning Their "Police Like" Identification Badges to Chief of Police (Parsons)

Councilmember Parsons spoke on how a while back the State Attorney General issued an opinion that said only people in law enforcement should carry a badge that looks like you are in law enforcement. Recently the State Attorney General clarified that opinion and said only people who are in a law enforcement-like capacity, which could be code enforcement and animal control, should be carrying badges like this. Councilmember Parsons suggested that his colleagues turn in their badges back to the Chief of Police.

Councilmember Parsons moved, seconded by Councilmember Juarez, to return their badges back to the Chief of Police. There was no vote taken at this time.

Councilmember Parsons then moved, seconded by Councilmember Juarez, to turn badges in and have them mounted on a plaque.

• Temporary suspension of Development Impact Fees (Guidi)

Due to a recent article that stated Hawthorne had a 16% unemployment rate, Mayor Guidi is looking for a way to create more business for the community and a way to bring in new development and jobs to the community. But due to increased development impact fees, several projects have stalled so he suggested the temporary suspension of development impact fees. Three or four projects could be rolling now if the developers didn't have to pay the development impact fees.

Mayor Guidi moved, seconded by Councilmember Lambert, to temporarily suspend development impact fees.
