

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD OCTOBER 13, 2009.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Reverend Dina Ferguson from St. George's Church gave the evening's invocation. Parks and Recreation Assistant Director Mark Hardison led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilmember Juarez presented a Proclamation to Katy Holmes of the American Cancer Society in recognition of National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Anyone who is going through cancer and needs help can call 800-ACS-2345.

Tori Kjer from the Trust for Public Land gave a presentation on the proposed revitalization of Bicentennial Park, a park that is currently locked. The Trust for Public Land is a national, non-profit that has been around since the 70s. Its mission is to work in cities and suburbs to insure that everyone, especially children, enjoy close to home access to a park, playground or natural area. The proposed project meets the Proposition 84 grant application requirements and would be a collaboration of the City, The Trust for Public Land, From Lot to Spot, the County and the community.

Under oral communications **Mohammad Farooqui** stated that his landlord blocked his rear door when he complained about parking standards and that the city approved the blockage. **Patricia Donaldson**, President and CEO of the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce, announced that on October 29th there will be a mixer at Beach Cities Aviation Academy. Introduced new chamber members Robin McCall and Pat Carey of Beach Cities Aviation Academy, Romy Davidoff, Founder and Art Director of RD Design and Advertising, Pastor Dave Manila of Ocean Gate Baptist Church, Darlene Font of Hyatt Summerfield Suites, Esmeralda Orozco of Trans America Multiservices, Danny Fontenot of Allstate and Del Rey Grill. **Ammar Kahf**, Islamic Center of Hawthorne, invited everybody to attend their open house on October 18th from 3pm to 5:30pm. Supports the reopening of Bicentennial Park. **Alex Monteiro**, 12413 Ramona Ave., announced that the Hawthorne Presidents Council will put on a barbeque dinner on October 22nd from 5pm to 8pm. The dinner is to fundraise for the Holiday Assistance Program. Asked that candidates who are running for council not bash city departments or employees. **Olivia Valentine** announced that there will be a gala fundraiser for her at Beach Cities Aviation Academy on October 29th from 7pm to 9pm. Everyone is welcome to attend. **Walt Dixon**, 4378 W. 138th St., asked that candidates campaign on the issues only instead of character assassination, innuendo, false rumors and out and out lies. **Darlene Love** asked candidates to be honest. **Sebastian King**, with Housing and Urban Development, invited the Mayor to have a meeting to discuss city issues. **Leithelle Williams**, 4054 138th St., introduced herself as a candidate for city council. **Greg Fallon**, 5412 W. 149th Pl., introduced himself as a candidate for city council. **Gerry Neibel**, 12125 Menlo Ave., thanked Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr, Public Works and Mayor Larry Guidi for the new railroad crossing at Birch. **Francis Stiglich** stated she does not want any more low income housing in her neighborhood. Asked that everybody take a good look at who is running and choose the people that are good and are going to do more for you and not just think about everybody else and not the people that are living in here. Thanked Mayor Guidi and Councilmember Lambert for making her neighborhood safer. **Idris Traina**, Islamic Center of Hawthorne, asked that the impact fees be reviewed for everyone because we want to be competitive with other cities, but also for non-profit organizations in these hard times. Unidentified speaker, representing several property owners in Hawthorne, complained that signs are being posted on private property without the owners' permission. When the owners take down the signs, the signs reappear days later and the property owners are told they must keep the signs up. Asked for an explanation on what the law is regarding this issue. **Pat Cary**, 4588 W. 130th St., introduced himself as a candidate for City Clerk. **Alex Vargas**, 11974A York Ave., asked for a clean election with no character assassinations. Reported that at the St. Joseph Carnival there was a voter registration drive where 30 new voters were registered.

Thanked Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr for securing \$2.3million in stimulus funds to construct new sewers. Thanked all those who volunteered for the "Life Without Limbs" event. Encouraged citizens to attend the candidate's forum for the Hawthorne and Centinela Valley school candidates on the 15th that is being hosted by the Ramona Neighborhood Association.

Councilmember **Parsons** announced that the Hollyglen Homeowners Association will be holding a candidate's forum for the Mayor and City Council positions on October 14th at 7pm at Dana Middle School. LA County Fire Department C.E.R.T. training will be available beginning on November 7th for three consecutive Saturdays. On October 15th at 7pm, the LA County Fire Dept. will hold a free demonstration at the Memorial Center on how to survive after a major earthquake. Council meetings will soon be available on the city website.

Mayor **Guidi** inquired on who to contact regarding the new mail service schedule that is being delivered late in the evening. Reported that Expresso Medical Clinic at 13672 Hawthorne Blvd. has flu shots available for \$25. Would like to assist the church in LA that has started a food bank for animals. Asked that we reach out to former Councilmember Chuck Bookhammer's family as he is going through some health issues.
