

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD NOVEMBER 10, 2009.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Catano, Juarez, Lambert, Parsons, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: None.

Phil Cookes from South Bay Celebration Church gave the evening's invocation. will give the invocation tonight. Francis Stiglich led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Under oral communications **Darlene Love**, 2003 W. 116<sup>th</sup> St., hopes that the new Council will not be divided. Thanked everyone who came out to vote. **Mohammad Farooqui** said that the director of planning was not telling the truth about the situation at his business regarding the parking arrangement and whether cars were blocking the back door of his business. Mayor Guidi said that it is a civil issue between him and his landlord and that Farooqui should have his attorney marshal together the necessary documents to file his Complaint. **Dennis Floyd** addressed concerns regarding the last election where they were directed to go to 11604 Prairie to vote but were refused entrance once they got there and ended up voting on a table on Prairie. Was disappointed in the number of voters that turned out to vote. **Francis Stiglich** congratulated all those who won. Did not appreciate dirty political flyers that were sent out. Disappointed with the low voter turn out. **Ronnie Manson** stated that even though he has moved out of Hawthorne, he will still help out in Hawthorne. Reported on two incidents on Hawthorne Blvd. where he was almost run-over. **Nilo Michelin**, Hawthorne School Board, thanked all the Hawthorne voters for their support. Since state budget cuts are coming, feels it is important that we work together so that the cuts don't affect the school district or the city. Invited everyone to attend Hawthorne Math and Science Academy for the dedication of a new building on Thursday at 5pm. **Alex Vargas**, 11974 York Ave., stated that he is looking forward to working with the Mayor and Council and doing great things for the City of Hawthorne. Expressed concern over the possibility of the senior center losing its nutritional program and asked if the city could do something to help. **Alex Monteiro**, 12413 Ramona Ave., congratulated the winners of the election and thanked everyone who voted for him. He will continue to work in the city for the people who are economically challenged. Wished Councilmembers Parsons and Catano a happy retirement from Council. Still needs 120 turkeys to donate to needy families by November 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Parsons** congratulated the new elected officials. Congratulated Chief Heffner on having 102 officers. Inquired if the City has an ordinance like the one that the City of LA recently passed requiring anti graffiti coating on new developments. Thanked city staff for helping to organize the 2<sup>nd</sup> LA County Fire Dept. C.E.R.T. class which was held November 7<sup>th</sup> with 30 residents participating.

Councilmember **Lambert** announced that because of unforeseen things in the future up until December or so, she will have to cancel the estate sale, but will bring it back in the future. Warned residents that people have been knocking on doors and then disappearing when you start to open the door and suggested looking out your window to see who it is. If it is someone you do not recognize you may want to call the police. Was very hurt and disappointed that someone put out flyers that destroy people's reputations during the recent election period.

Councilmember **Juarez** congratulated the municipal and school board winners of the recent election. Congratulated the Hawthorne School District for eliminating a number of portable classrooms and replacing them with two new buildings. Thanked the Islamic Center of Hawthorne for their invitation to their banquet this past weekend. Commended city employee Peggy Holt for her efforts in decorating the IT department for Halloween. Attended the first workshop for the renovation of Bicentennial Park and was impressed by the Environmental High School kid's ideas for the park. There will be a 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting on

November 19<sup>th</sup> from 6pm to 8pm at All Saints Church on 132<sup>nd</sup> and Doty; everyone is encouraged to attend. Announced that 9 to 5 Seating would like to come to the city but they have asked for a waiver of impact development fees. Councilmember Juarez proposed that they pay the fee, with the anticipation that the consultant who is studying the fees will come back with a much lower fee. If that is the case, we would then refund the developer the difference.

Mayor **Guidi** congratulated everyone for participating in the elections. Commended Chief Heffner for the video cams on the motor officer’s helmets. This will help prevent unnecessary complaints. Invited everyone to attend a memorial service in honor of Veterans Day at the VFW tomorrow at 11:00am.
