

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD NOVEMBER 24, 2009.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meeting to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 West 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

**Discussion/Action Items:**

- "No smoking" clause to be included in rental agreements for city owned buildings (Juarez)

Councilmember Juarez stated that due to the city investing a lot of money in trying to buy affordable housing which is an asset to the city, these assets should be taken care of and feels that in order to maintain them, we should not allow smoking inside the apartments.

Mayor Guidi moved, seconded by Councilmember Parsons, to include a no smoking clause in rental agreements for city owned buildings.

- Budget/financial update (Guidi)

At the request of Mayor Guidi, City Manager Jag Pathirana presented a brief budget update. A general fund budget was approved a few months back that showed revenues of \$52.4 million with planned spending of \$52.4million with a small surplus of \$10,000 at the beginning of this fiscal year. Subsequent to that, due to the state of the economy and everything else, things have gone downhill. Because of that we are projecting to revise some revenue numbers. Sales tax, hotel motel bed tax, franchise fees, public service safety fees, construction permits and other permits are all projected to go down. On the positive side, we are looking to increase the citations, parking and vehicle code fines. Overall, revenues are projected to decline by \$880,000 between now and the end of the fiscal year. As far as expenditure plans for the balance of the fiscal year, we are looking at a savings of \$125,000 for

for health insurance costs due to PERS giving public agencies a break in this area. As result of the changes, we are looking at revenues of \$51.6 million, expenditures of \$52.7 million and a deficit of \$1.1 million.

- Appointment of Henry Ramirez to the Civil Service Commission (Guidi)

Councilmember **Parsons** stated that it has been a pleasure serving the city and the residents for the past eight years and seeing how the city has improved. Will be coming back to help the city out in a volunteer, non-political capacity. Thanked everybody for their support and dedication.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked the Hawthorne/Lawndale Ministerial Association and their secretary Rosalinda Martinez for the Thanksgiving Luncheon they had last week where over 500 people attended. Also thanked the volunteers from Behavioral Health Services, Teen Challenge and city department heads and employees for their participation. Visited the new showroom of Bruder, a German toy company that recently came to Hawthorne. Thanked Councilmember Parsons and Catano for their years of service and support.
