

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD JULY 27, 2010.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 W. 126<sup>th</sup> Street, Hawthorne, California.

Father Gene Buhr of St. Joseph's Church gave the evening's invocation. Boy Scout Troop # 484 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

About 200 people attended this important first step in the process to revitalize the site. **Darlene Love** attended the mall brainstorming session on Saturday and recalled the community relations and police offices that used to be at the mall. Reported that the car show brought in a lot of business for the 99¢ Store on the boulevard. **Don Rowe**, Hawthorne Library, reported that the summer reading program for kids is going strong. On July 31<sup>st</sup> there will be a cartoon workshop for kids at the library. Due to the library closing on Fridays, preschool story time will now be held on Thursdays at 11am. **Nilo Michelin** spoke against putting a used car dealership at 13736 Hawthorne Blvd and in the

city in general. **Allen Richards** thanked the Councilmembers who attended the Ramona picnic. Would like Council to speak to the Daily Breeze so that they cover more city events.

Hopes that this working group continues so that the community's likes and dislikes can be heard. Would also like to meet with the owner of the mall to get an overview of what he plans or would ultimately like to see at the site. Thanked the Ramona neighborhood association for the invitation to the picnic. Requested an update on the status of the 70 businesses that have yet to receive their licenses because of issues with the fire department. Would like to see a round table discussion between the city and the fire department as to how these licenses could be streamlined. Commended Greg McClain in Planning for working with agencies to become a CHODO. Would also like a status on homelessness in the community with regards to stimulus money. Thanked everyone for their birthday greetings.

Councilmember **Lambert** inquired if we have a conditional use permit in place for used car businesses and if we have some way of protecting the city from repeated use of the land instead of something that is more inviting to the community. Apologized for not being able to attend the Ramona picnic due to family commitments.

Councilmember **Vargas** thanked the visitors that attended his meet and greet Monday night and for sharing their concerns with him. Congratulated Teen Challenge, Pastor Cookes and Mayor Guidi on the great success of the car show and feels it is a great way of uniting Hawthorne. Thanked Lisa Miller for the regular reports on the problem areas that code enforcement has been dealing with. Thanked everyone for attending the mall brainstorming session; without everyone's support and contributions of ideas, the event would not have been a success. Thanked Allen Richards for the Ramona picnic which was a good neighborhood reunion. Wished Councilmembers Lambert and English a very happy birthday. Stated that the situation in the cities of Bell and Maywood is a good example of what kind of things not to do and assured the community that Council is working hard to keep the city moving forward and doing the right thing.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked Councilmember Vargas for bringing the community together to talk about the former Hawthorne Mall. Announced that Nathan's / Arthur's Fish & Chips just opened in Hawthorne. Thanked Mr. Richards and the Ramona board for the great picnic; it is fun to see the community come out and exchange information and looks forward to the Holly Park picnic. Attended the Chamber mixer which was held at a natural herb medicine shop. Asked for a better solution regarding the business permit process. Wished Councilmember Lambert, Councilmember English and Rosalinda Martinez a happy birthday. Thanked City Manager Mitsch for his extra hard work in trying to stabilize the city but would like to see more communication on people and contracts and arrangements in reports.

City Clerk **Huber** spoke on the passing of Cora Travers and the good she did in the community. Announced that there would be ice cream, cookies and bingo on National Night out at Ramona at 7pm. Stated that acupuncture is a business that is not allowed in the city and if it is something that Council wants to look into. Reported on a serious accident that occurred in Ramona and asked if anything besides more patrol and citations could be done in the area as stop signs are constantly being ignored. Due to receiving inquiries regarding the Bell salary situation, clarified that Bell is a charter city and Hawthorne is a general law city. General Law cities abide by the guidelines of the state of California who set limits on Council salaries.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** congratulated Allen Richards on 10 years with the Ramona group. Has noticed that more people are walking in the Ramona tract. Thanked Councilmember Vargas and Gordon Mego

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for bringing about the mall meeting and feels the owner is ready to go forward.
