

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD SEPTEMBER 14, 2010.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:03 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 W. 126<sup>th</sup> Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers Lambert, English, Juarez, Vargas, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: None

Pastor Eddie Vargas from Lawndale Christian Church gave the evening's invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A brief video from the 9<sup>th</sup> annual Memorial to 9/11 was shown.

Mayor Guidi presented a Proclamation to Pastor Greg Merrill in honor of Centinela Bible Church's 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Pastor Merrill also published a book of homes in the Ramona area, with all proceeds going back to the Ramona Homeowners Association.

Dr. Helen Morgan, Hawthorne School District Superintendent, gave an update on school happenings. School has started but unfortunately enrollment is down by about 275 students from the same day last year. Classes are running pretty close to capacity. Hawthorne Math and Science Academy has been named a blue ribbon school; only 25 schools in California receive this honorable distinction. The bond oversite committee, except for one member, will require all new members; applications for this committee will be available soon. District APIs have gone up. The district API is 783 with the state target being 800. Hawthorne Math and Science Academy received an API of 883, the highest in the district. Centinela Valley Adult School is holding some of their ESL classes in the district. Back to School nights are tomorrow at Prairie Vista, Eucalyptus, Zela Davis and Washington Schools; all are welcome to attend.

Mel Calloway, Executive Vice President with Kinecta Federal Credit Union, gave a presentation on what they want to do in the City of Hawthorne to expand their relationship with the city as well as with the members and families in the community. Kinecta originally began as the Howard Hughes Credit Union and recently bought Nix check cashing. Kinecta soon be moving to a new site on El Segundo and Hawthorne Boulevard.

Tom Quintana and Patricia Donaldson of the Lions and Kiwanis Clubs presented a check to Dr. Helen Morgan for the family of Chiona Okeke. The Okeke family was in a severe car accident that caused the death of Chiona, a Hawthorne School District student.

The meeting recessed for cake to celebrate Councilmember Vargas' birthday.

Thanked the city and employees for achieving a balanced budget. Inquired on where revenue comes from percentage wise and if revenue comes from property tax value. Would like to see a plan put together for the quality of life of our citizens and visitors. **Estela Villanueva** presented a petition for a stop sign and lighting in the area of 118<sup>th</sup> Street and Doty. **Mike Castillo**, on behalf of Assemblyman Bradford, invited the non-profits in the area to the California Legislative Black Caucus Foundation "Meet the Corporate Funders" event on September 24<sup>th</sup> at Loyola Marymount University from 8am to 1pm. This event is meant to bring together non-profit organizations and corporate funders to come and meet and talk about how they could potentially fund some of their programs. There will be food and giveaways; everyone is welcome.

Councilmember **Juarez** attended the 7 Eleven grand opening on Hawthorne Boulevard. This was an outdated store that the owner gutted from top to bottom. Encouraged the patronage of this business, especially if you like coffee since it now serves about 15 different varieties. The owner is also willing to open another store in the city if he finds the right location. Attended the Holypark Homeowners Association where there were a lot of good speakers. Stated that there is a non-profit organization called the JET Foundation that goes to skid row every weekend to provide blankets and easy opening canned food to the people there. Attended the North Hawthorne Homeowners meeting which had a jam packed agenda, lots of good speakers and a gentleman from Youth Build that is looking for individuals that want to get into the pre-apprentice training. Received a call from a resident regarding concerns with the smart meters and radiation but assured that the emissions are less than what is emitted from a cell phone. While attending the North Hawthorne Community Association meeting it was expressed by the residents that the graffiti control department is doing a superb job. Announced there will be another unity basketball tournament in November; all community groups are invited to participate. The Hawthorne Police Department and the City of Hawthorne will hold a blood drive on September 28<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 3pm at the HPD Community Room.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked City Manager Jim Mitsch for the great job on the budget. Apologized

for not being able to attend the 9/11 ceremony, but thanked his wife and children for attending on his behalf.
