The last meeting will be held on March 28<sup>th</sup> at the Moose Lodge; donations are still being accepted. Volunteer Appreciation Day will be held on April 17<sup>th</sup>; nomination forms are due by tomorrow at noon and can be faxed to 310-970-0193. Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Juarez** thanked everyone for their birthday wishes. Congratulated Wiseburn and the Hollypark Little Leagues on their opening day ceremonies, City Clerk Huber on becoming a grandfather and James O'Grady for being elected president of the Ramona Neighborhood Association. Gave a big thanks to Al Richards for a fantastic job in leading the Ramona Neighborhood Association and making it what it is today. Asked that another look be taken at the overtime report monthly average because it does

not look like it has been calculated correctly. Read a public health announcement stating that there is no increased risk of radiation exposure from the nuclear power complex situation in Japan. Announced that Assemblyman Steve Bradford will be putting on a health care reform community forum on March 26<sup>th</sup> at the Lawndale Library from 1pm to 3pm, that there will be another meeting regarding the expansion of the metro system maintenance yard on March 31<sup>st</sup> at Inglewood City Hall from 6pm to 8pm, that the Wiseburn Education Foundation will be having its 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Rock-Around-the-Block on April 9<sup>th</sup>, that the South Bay Workforce Investment Board will be holding a youth job fair on April 7<sup>th</sup> from 8am to 1pm, that the Hawthorne Parks and Recreation Foundation will be holding its annual golf tournament on April 4<sup>th</sup> at the California Country Club and that former Councilman Steve Andersen and also Ray Piercing with Century 21 passed away.

Councilmember **Vargas** directed the city attorney to update a city ordinance to clarify which city personnel may enter into a binding legal agreement and the City Manager to retrieve city artifacts from the Torrance resident that is holding them as we now have a board, location and volunteers in place to run the historical society. Attended Hollypark Little League opening day ceremonies and joined the Eagle Scouts in planting trees at Hollypark and Jim Thorpe Park. Commended Hollypark residents for their homeowner's cleanup event and congratulated the new board of the Ramona Homeowners Association.

Councilmember **Lambert** attended the Sanitation District meeting where the subject of flushing meds down the toilet was brought up. This is of concern because the meds could end up in the water stream. As an alternative, it is suggested that meds be crushed into the coffee grinds for disposal or to take them to your local pick up sites when available. Reminded everyone that there is an ordinance that prohibits leaving your trash barrels out front.

Councilmember **English** announced that there will be a Women's Veterans Symposium tomorrow at the Memorial Center. Toured the new California Veterans Housing Facilities built for vets that are disabled and/or handicapped. Will provide applications to the housing department so veterans who meet certain criteria can fill out the applications and maybe receive housing. Asked that code enforcement review the tile business at 147<sup>th</sup> and Inglewood for possible safety issues regarding the storage of crates and for an update on properties that are currently being litigated. Would like to take a look at the easement between 145<sup>th</sup> and 147<sup>th</sup> Streets to discuss who owns the oil wells and property in that area and if there is still a homelessness problem there and about the corner of Hawthorne and Imperial for an update on the vacant Chevron station there. Requested a ride-along with code enforcement to look at the Imperial corridor and a tour of the old police station. Thanked the public works department for the improvements on Inglewood. Offered condolences to SBWIB Executive Director Jan Vogel and his family on the passing of his brother.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked the Chamber of Commerce and Ashley Furniture for the chamber mixer and Allen Richards for the reports he gives on the city. Congratulated the Ramona board. Asked that public works look into why the trash is being picked up so late. Concerned that a cigar shop across the street is advertising blunts. Reported that an eatery on Imperial is not up to the city's color code.

City Clerk **Huber** announced that Trinity Lutheran of Hawthorne is inviting the public to attend the installation of their outreach Pastor Johnson with a gospel concert following this Sunday at 1:45 pm. A demonstration of the new police segways was given at the Ramona neighborhood association meeting. The service provider fair and community earth day will be held on April 9<sup>th</sup> with a display of the police helicopter. The ranger program, to a limited degree, has been restored in some parks. The next meeting of the historical society will be on April 14<sup>th</sup> at the police department community room at 6pm. Announced the birth of his granddaughter, the fourth generation that lives in Hawthorne.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** wished Councilmember Juarez a happy birthday. Attended the chamber mixer at Ashley Furniture and encouraged the public to visit this new store
