

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,

Under Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations:

Mayor **Guidi** requested moving Councilmember's Discussion/Action Items right before Elected Officials Reports and Recommendations be presented on the next agenda for approval. Thanked Councilmember Angie English and Tom Quintana for bringing together the Service Provider Fair and Earth Day events.

Suggested putting in a remote control car area at the Memorial Center. Donated various artifacts to the Historical Society. Cautioned staff that is in a decision making position that if they wouldn't put something next to their home, then council does not want it in the city either. Appreciates the work that Code Enforcement does and would like to step up enforcement. Requested a closed session for the next agenda to discuss labor negotiations.

Councilmember **Lambert** encouraged residents to attend the Water and Energy Expo on May 21st from 9am -12pm at the recycling center at 1935 S. Hughes Way, El Segundo. Apologized for not being able to attend the Service Provider Fair.

Councilmember **Juarez** congratulated Alex Monteiro and all those who helped put the Relay for Life event together. Thanked the VFW Post for inviting him to their 80th Anniversary celebration. Thanked all those who participated in the Hawthorne Parks and Recreation Foundation Golf Tournament. Congratulated Councilmember English on the great turnout at the Service Provider Fair. Attended the 8th Annual Rock-Around-the-Block event for the Wiseburn Education Foundation. Along with members of the Fusion Homeowners Association, attended the public hearing to speak against the expansion of the maintenance facility yard near the Fusion complex. Attended Assemblyman Bradford's Health Care Forum where the topic of the affordable health care act was discussed. Reported that unemployment figures in Hawthorne had gone down from 16.1 to 15.9 and attributed some of this success to SBWIB Executive Director Jan Vogel for putting residents to work. Thanked the Hollyglen Homeowners Association for having someone speak about the health care issue and educating people on what they need to do. Asked that we take a look at a paperless agenda. Announced that the Hawthorne Historical Society will hold an open meeting at the Hawthorne Police Department Community Room on Thursday.

Councilmember **Vargas** attended the Relay for Life and VFW Post events. Congratulated Councilmember English for the Service Provider Fair event and city staff for the Earth Day event. Congratulated John Burrus on his Eagle Scout project at Trinity Lutheran. Requested a report on the status of the recuperation of city artifacts. Respectfully requested that city council members and other department staff that are not part of enforcement activities to please refrain from directly participating in enforcement activities by code enforcement and the police. Congratulated the police department on the decline of illegal product vendors at the Ralph's parking lot, but the trash issue in the area still needs to be addressed. Brought in used linens to donate to the local dog pound and encouraged others to donate also. Helped collect \$6000 at the fundraiser given by Mayor Guidi and the chef of Il Toscano restaurant for the Japan earthquake victims.

Councilmember **English** thanked all the individuals and agencies who were instrumental in making the 2nd Annual Service Provider Fair a success. Announced that the Bunny Breakfast will be held on April 16th from 9am to 11am at the Memorial Center. Mentioned that March was Women's Month and spoke on the significance of Denim Day. Toured Imperial and throughout the city with Code Enforcement to see what the enforcement officers do. Asked that the city manager's office review on how it can cut down on paper usage through various packets that the council receives; she is comfortable receiving hers via email. Asked that April be designated as Autism Month. Took Cesar Chavez Day as an opportunity to work at the city and review it, but has still to review the old police station. Announced that the California Legislative Black Caucus is having the Healthy Lifestyles Initiative Conference at the California Science Center on April 29th. Asked that the city manager provide information on the estimated fire suppression and emergency medical services for the city. Promoted metro vanpools and everything you can do to carpool. Congratulated Chief Fager on his employees of the month and the work and safety that they provide. Announced that there are two more public hearings regarding CDBG funds where the community can advocate on what the money should be spent on.

City Clerk **Huber** announced that Hawthorne Math and Science Academy received Blue Ribbon recognition. Stated that the expediency of the Inglewood Ave. improvement project is appreciated. Announced that the Historical Society is tentatively planning a Good Neighbors Day for July 16th and there is a possibility that former celebrities from Hawthorne will be returning to celebrate.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** commented that it is good to see that our history is being preserved. Attended the Relay for Life event, Earth Day and the Service Provider Fair. Thanked everybody who participates at city functions.
