

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA HELD APRIL 26, 2011.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:02 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 W. 126th Street, Hawthorne, California.

Absent: None

Father Perry Leiker from St. Joseph's Church gave the evening's invocation. Jonathan Lubenec led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Finance Manager Lani Emmich conducted the drawing for the fireworks stands. Nine organizations qualified for the drawing. A total of eight stands are available with two of the stands automatically going to the VFW and the American Legion. The six chosen were:

City Clerk Huber announced that this was the time and place for the Public Hearing: This is a City-initiated application to amend Hawthorne Municipal Code (HMC) Sections 17.04 (Definitions), 17.25 (C-1 Freeway Commercial/Mixed Use Classification), 17.26 (C-2 Local Commercial Classification), 17.28 (C-3 General Commercial Classification), 17.30 (M-P industrial Park Classification), 17.32 (M-1 limited Industrial Classification) and 17.58 (Off-Street Parking). The amendment will establish tattoo and body piercing as permitted uses in industrial zones and family entertainment centers in commercial zones, will reorganize and alphabetize the permitted uses in commercial zones, and create “prohibited uses” sections in commercial zone chapters.

Planning Department’s declaration publication filed. No written communications were received.

Mayor Guidi called for public comments.

Nicolas Torrey proposed that tattoo parlors be allowed in the C3 Zone.

Congratulated all the volunteers that were recognized at Volunteer Appreciation Day. Requested a discussion/action item for the next agenda in order to take a formal position on the Wespac Pipeline.

Councilmember **English** visited the Castle this morning to sit and go over the activities of 40 preschoolers. Expressed disappointment over how the state is cutting CDBG funds. This weekend will be attending the California State Democratic Party Convention in Sacramento where she hopes to advocate for needed things in the city. Is glad that efforts are being made to bring a museum to Hawthorne. Wished everyone a happy Cinco de Mayo. Provided first aid kits from the Service Provider Fair to department heads. Thanked everyone for their support of Denim Day.

Councilmember **Vargas** reported that at the youth job fair that took place at the Memorial Center, a total of 63 students were hired on the spot, with an additional 28 more hired afterwards. Represented the city at the Enugu Association of Greater Los Angeles, the Nigerian community's local cultural group and commended the Nigerian community for being an active participant in Hawthorne. Spoke in remembrance of Cesar Chavez. Attended a conference in Atlanta sponsored by the NALEO group (National Association of Latino Elected Officials) where the theme of the meeting was "Healthy Communities, How We Can Implement Them." Also visited civil rights sites in the area.

Mayor **Guidi** announced that from May 9th to May 11th, the Wings of Freedom Tour will be held at Hawthorne Airport. Inquired on policy for commercial vehicles parked in residential neighborhoods and asked that this policy be refreshed across the board to everyone. Announced that the Lawndale Performing Arts Center will finally open after 10 years of construction. The first production is titled "Lawndale Live" and will be performed by the Lawndale High School Drama

Department, to be held tomorrow. Appreciates the input that the Council gave to the Historical Society. The Historical Society will hold Good Neighbor Day on July 16th at Hawthorne High.
