Police Chief Robert Fager thanked the elected officials, city manager and departments for the outstanding personal and professional support that the police department received after the passing of Officer Garton. It made the adjustments that quickly had to be done more bearable, putting the human side before everything else. The support was deeply appreciated.

Mayor Guidi presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Fili Lamas, owner of Chips 50's Café, in recognition of his support, participation and involvement with the Hawthorne/Lawndale Ministerial Association Breakfast held on June 8, 2011.

Under oral communications, **Delorez Ramos** thanked Sgt. Cognac and the police department for helping her with vandalism problems in her neighborhood. Was honored to have known Officer Garton. **Allen Richards** paid tribute to fathers in honor of Father's Day. **Pat Donaldson**, Chamber of Commerce President, announced that there would be no mixer in July due to summer break and that their installation would be held on August 25th at 7am at the Memorial Center. Thanked Assemblyman Steve Bradford for nominating her business, Abacus Security Services, for Business of the Year. Thanked the businesses that sent her to the \$1000 luncheon with Michelle Obama yesterday. **Jose Gutierrez** questioned why there has not been an update on the city budget, why the residents have not been asked for input regarding the budget, the amount of the general fund reserves and why the latest financial statements are not posted online. **Alex Monteiro** offered his deepest sympathies to the Hawthorne Police Department and to the family of Officer Andrew Garton. Thanked City Treasurer Thierry Lubenec for attending his father's memorial service on Saturday. Reported that the Lions Club handed out 100 flags to 100 kindergarteners in honor of Flag Day. Reminded everyone that the 16th Annual Health Fair and 5K Run will be held on June 18th from 8am to 12pm at Memorial Park. **Gordon Mego** lamented the passing of Officer Andrew Garton by reading a poem entitled "We Never Walk Alone". Spoke on efforts to conserve the historical integrity of Leuzinger High School. **Katrina Manning**, Holly Park Home Owners Association Vice President, announced that the association will hold their 2nd Annual Pancake Breakfast on June 18th from 8am to 11am at Pacifica House, 2501 W. El Segundo Blvd. On June 25th, the 1st Annual Movies in the Park event will be held at Holly Park from 5pm to 10:30pm. **Gary Evans** of Pizza Show spoke on the parking crisis in the city and gave suggestions for providing extra parking spaces on the boulevard. **Wyneva Chenault Flores** asked why the clutter on Inglewood Avenue with the new medium. She clarified that the budget is prepared by the city manager and the staff at the appropriate time. Also did not appreciate that he touched on the subject of missing HUD money again when an audit had already proved that there was no missing money.

Councilmember **Juarez** praised Officer Andrew Garton for the fantastic man he was and thanked all the agencies that did everything they did to send him out like a king. He will definitely be missed.

Councilmember **Vargas** spoke on how the last three weeks have been very hard on the city, the department and a lot of people with regards to the passing of Officer Andrew Garton and how we should continue to stick by his family. Reported that there was a great turnout at Nathan's for the hot dog eating contest with a lot of community leaders participating; thanked Gary Premeaux, Gold's Gym and all the community groups for their participation. Announced that Movies in the Park will be held on June 25th. Chivas USA/Hawthorn Police will hold a fireworks safety awareness event on June 28th at city hall at 2pm. The Hawthorne Health and Sports Fair will be held on June 18th from 8am to 12pm. Stated that he still has open office hours on Mondays before the council meetings.

Mayor **Guidi** commended Chief Fager and his troops for putting together a tribute to honor Officer Garton that his family and sons will never forget. Inquired if apartment buildings are considered commercial buildings and if the color code addresses that. Taxis and commercial vehicles are starting to park again in residential areas. Has received a lot of good feedback regarding the beatification of Inglewood Avenue; regarding the gaps on the avenue, it is because those sections belong to County. Will work with Mark Ridley-Thomas to get an okay to fill the gaps. Inquired why Pirate Employment was

able to open at their location what with there being parking issues and also this business has a problem with loitering that needs to be addressed. Metal clothing containers are popping up in neighborhood parking lots and storefronts which are becoming a graffiti haven. Programs need to be implemented to clean up and get positive development going on Imperial Highway as it is still a sore spot with the Council. On a positive note, a letter of congratulations needs to be sent to Seers Lumber for reinvesting in the city; they have rebuilt and made a lot of improvements to their property and also to businesses on Prairie between Jack Northrop and 120th to Rosecrans that have also reinvested in the city by making improvements. Congratulated Mayor Pro Tem Vargas for the Nathan's event. Requested to agendize an item to look at a budgetary line item giving each Councilmember \$2500 a budget to use for example, for waiving of fees.

City Clerk **Huber** thanked the city employees who gave blood today at the American Red Cross blood drive. Fourteen units of blood that will save 45 lives were collected. Everyone who donated received a free ticket to the surf music concert. The planning committee has met with Former Beach Boy David Marks who will not be charging a fee for his appearance, but is attending out of a sincere desire to give back to his hometown of Hawthorne.
