

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD JUNE 28, 2011.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:03 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 W. 126<sup>th</sup> Street, Hawthorne, California.

Father Eugene Buhr from St. Joseph Church gave the evening's invocation. Patricia Feldman led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Finance Manager Lani Emmich gave a brief update on the budget for Fiscal Year 2011-2012. Currently for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 we are looking at \$126.3 million for a city wide budget which is a decrease from the current year that we are in of \$121.4 million which is mainly a result of result of decreased funding from federal sources. The general fund right now for next fiscal year stands at a deficit of \$1,561,933.

Under oral communications, **Pat Donaldson**, Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce President, announced that the Chamber Installation breakfast will be held on August 25<sup>th</sup> at 7am at the Memorial Center. Announced that her business, Abacus Security Services, just opened an office in Nevada, will open an office in Arizona next month and just opened PD & Associates in Hawthorne. **James O'Grady**, Ramona Neighborhood Association President, spoke on the new influx of young, educated, up and comers who have come to Hawthorne and how their voices are being lost by their representation. Feels Council is acting in conflict with the major demographic of the city. **Sandra Suarez** asked for Council's support in the efforts to preserve the remaining historical buildings of Leuzinger High School. **Gordon Mego** announced that on June 29<sup>th</sup> at 5pm, the Centinela Valley Union High School District will hold a special meeting open to the public regarding changes at the Leuzinger campus. **Katrina Manning**, Hollypark Homeowners Association Vice President, spoke on the success of the Movies in the Park event and thanked the Mayor and Council for supporting the event. Announced that National Night Out will be held on August 2<sup>nd</sup> from 6pm to 9pm. **Estella Villanueva**, North Hawthorne Community Association Secretary, thanked Council for sponsoring Movies in the Park and expressed gratitude for the opportunity to have participated in such a motivated event. **Ike Mbelu** invited the Mayor and Council to the Nnewi USA National Convention on July 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9:30 pm at the Memorial Center. **John Bowler**, former Mayor and Councilmember from Hermosa Beach and currently a food truck operator, suggested that food trucks be allowed to continue on a test period basis as they have done economic wonders in a number of cities and they can serve as fundraising devices. **Dana McKinley** spoke in favor of allowing gourmet food trucks in the city. **Sanjeev Weerasuriya** of Systems Technology, Inc. asked for consideration and suggested parking permits on the matter of the parking shortage for their employees on Hawthorne Blvd. **Dr. Sam Sawur**, Hawthorne business owner, spoke on how the employee parking situation on Hawthorne Blvd. is affecting business owners, residents and resident's safety. The City Attorney, Russell Miyahira, recommended that the settlement that has been proposed for the claim of former employee, Louis Escobar, for damages as a result of an alleged defamatory television broadcast on the Fox 11 News in the amount of \$10,000. The settlement agreement also requires that Mr. Escobar to release all other claims he may have against the City, including any right or claim to recall or reinstatement of employment with the City.

**RECOMMENDATION:** That the City Council approve the settlement of claim for \$10,000. Also authorize the Finance Department to release warrant in the amount of \$10,000 to Louis Escobar and William M. Crosby of Barnes Crosby Fitzgerald & Zeman, LLP.

#### Under City Council's Discussion/Action Items

A – Consider adopting a budget policy allowing each elected official to have a \$3,000 budget to be used to defer costs for community events. Example, one council member may use his/her budget for either one or several events to reimburse the city for set-up costs, permit fees, etc. (Guidi)

Mayor Guidi requested that this item be brought back as an agenda item for the next Council meeting and then the Council can vote.

#### Under Elected Official Reports and Recommendations:

Councilmember **Lambert** requested a report on the Big Bear property regarding why someone is living there for free.

Councilmember **English** commended the movies in the park and the hot dog eating contest which were great events. Would like the city to work with the businesses that are having issues with the two hour parking on Hawthorne Blvd., maybe come up with a compromise or look into getting permit parking. Regarding the food trucks, feels there is still room for discussion on this issue. Requested a legal confidential not just explaining the process, but an understanding of the whole incident in general, the legal ramifications and what has been done regarding the complaints of city employees regarding an incident that occurred on April 28<sup>th</sup>. Requested a legal confidential regarding the Centinela Valley School District issue to see if that is something the city can be involved in. Requested a history and the pros and cons of supporting the Mike Davis Assembly Bill regarding incarcerated individuals. Spoke in appreciation of James Mitch and his contributions to the city, but feels this is not the time for him to retire. Expressed concern that a 5-0 vote was passed that would be implemented into his city contract that would require a four vote to remove him and questioned why this was not followed.

Councilmember **Juarez** requested a letter be written to Jose Fernandez regarding the preservation of Leuzinger High School. Requested a copy of the ordinance on food trucks and to bring back the food truck issue as a discussion/item. Requested to bring back an ordinance regarding the hiring of individuals who have previously sued the city. Now that it is summer, encouraged the use of the wading pools in the parks. Congratulated the 9/11 Help America Foundation and the Hawthorne School District for their successful golf tournaments. Congratulated Alex Monteiro for the great job in putting on the Hawthorne Health and Sports Fair. Encouraged the public to patronize the non-profit organizations that got firework booths. Encouraged participation in the Good Neighbors Day event where original Beach Boy David Marks will perform. For tickets, go to [Hawthornehistorical.com](http://Hawthornehistorical.com).

Councilmember **Vargas** congratulated the Hollypark Homeowners Association and the North Hawthorne Community Association for coming together to put on the Movies in the Park event. Another community event held earlier today at city hall was Chivas USA and the fire department at city hall earlier today to give firework safety tips. Attended the Hollypark Pancake Breakfast. Congratulated Father Perry Leiker for his 12 years of service at St. Joseph Church. Asked that Mr. McClain be included in the process of looking into the viability of letting food trucks into the city. Inquired on the status of the property at 120<sup>th</sup> that was supposed to be sold. Thanked Mr. Mitsch for his good work.

Mayor **Guidi** praised the police department for the handling of crowd control at a charter school on Hawthorne Blvd. Cautioned Council to be careful when trying to change ordinances without looking at the history that led to them in the first place like in the case of lunch trucks. Asked Mr. Vogel to follow

up on SB776. He reported that it passed the labor and education assembly committee a week ago and is now scheduled to go to the assembly appropriations committee next Wednesday. Thanked the associations for Movies in the Park and suggested that they be rotated from park to park.

City Clerk **Huber** attended the Educational Foundation Golf Tournament. Feels the flowers and landscaping on Inglewood Ave are an improvement for the area. Thanked the police department for making him feel safe in the city. Spoke on how July 4<sup>th</sup> will be the country's 235<sup>th</sup> year of freedom and what a blessing it is to live in this country. Let Mr. Mitsch know that he has enjoyed working with him over the last year. Announced that Good Neighbors Day is coming up and encouraged businesses or sponsors to get involved. Former Beach Boy David Marks is volunteering his time to come to the event.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** reported that the Nathan's hot dog eating contest for the \$20,000 grand prize will be held on July 4<sup>th</sup> in New York; perhaps someone who participated in the contest at Nathan's in Hawthorne will win. Reported that there are five firework stands within a ½ mile of each other and perhaps next year this situation could be addressed. Hopes everyone had a good Father's Day. Thanked Mr. Mitsch for everything he has taught him about the city and its history within the last six months.
