**MINUTES OF A REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD AUGUST 9, 2011.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:20 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 W. 126<sup>th</sup> Street, Hawthorne, California.

ROLL CALL-Present: Councilmembers, English, Juarez, Vargas, Mayor Guidi.  
Absent: Lambert

Reverend Greg King from St. Joseph's Church gave the evening's invocation. John Vargas led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Greg King, the new Pastor of St. Joseph's Church, introduced himself to the community. He grew up in Hawthorne and his family has been here since 1928.

Chief Fager publicly recognized an outstanding group of police officers and investigators for their efforts in containing an armed robbery that occurred at Home Depot on July 26<sup>th</sup> and apprehending the suspects.

Hawthorne Presidents Council Chairman Alex Monteiro and Vice President Darlene Love presented an \$8000 check to Chief Fager for the K9 program. Proceeds were from an earlier K9 dinner that was held.

Robin Harris from Richards Watson & Gershon gave a presentation on AB26 and AB27, two bills that were recently signed by the Governor that affect redevelopment. AB26 and AB27 are two companion bills. AB26 is a bill that would eliminate redevelopment agencies unless the city that contains that redevelopment agency agrees to make certain payments to the state on an annual basis. The companion to AB26 dissolution is AB27. AB27 establishes the alternative voluntary redevelopment program. This is the method by which cities, in order to preserve their redevelopment agency, are able to opt-in to this program and agree to make on-going payments to the state.

Mayor Guidi took item No. 14 out of order.

You can call John Vargas at (310) 938-7976 or President Dan Mills at (310) 951-5881 to have supplies picked up from your home or you can drop them off at the September meeting. **Marvin Jackman**, Southern California Edison announced that their free lamp exchange program will take place on August 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> from 8am to 1pm at the Forum parking lot in Inglewood. manager's severance package. Also stated that the City's auditors quit working for the City Finance Department. **T.D. Madyun** requested help to get a refund on tickets he has received because he feels the city did not effectively plan for parking of residents and guests in the Oxford street area where he lives. **Darlene Love** spoke on her trip to Sacramento regarding redistricting and asked that campaigning be kept clean. **Craig Pringle** of New Journey Ministries expressed disappointment that a representative from the Islamic Center came before the council and painted a picture that was inaccurate and false regarding the Hawthorne camp issue. New Journey Ministries is willing and ready to meet with the Islamic Center regarding the camp. **Marjorie Drake** stated that New Journey Ministries has always worked with other organizations, residents and churches to bring cohesiveness and a good working environment for the people of Hawthorne and they are still willing to work with the Islamic Center to allow them the opportunity to enjoy the camp in Wrightwood. **Frances Stiglich** thanked Norb Huber and Tom Quintana for the Beach Boys event. Spoke on her trip to Sacramento regarding redistricting. Announced that she is running for city council. **Nilo Michelin**, Hawthorne School Boardmember, reported that he received a lot of complaints from business owners stating that the restriction on parking in the middle of Hawthorne Blvd. is hurting businesses. **Kyle Orleman** gave an update on redistricting. Hawthorne is currently included in an area that consists of LAX, Westchester, Inglewood, Lennox, Gardena, Lawndale and the portions of Torrance that are east of Hawthorne Blvd. These district lines are scheduled to be finalized on August 15<sup>th</sup>.

Councilmember **English** thanked Katrina Manning and the Hollypark Homeowners Association for their efforts in bringing about National Night Out and thanked the police and fire departments for their participation.

Councilmember **Juarez** requested a report on why the independent auditors for the city walked away and a report on what we have paid them and what we have recovered. Thanked the Hollypark Homeowners Association for National Night Out. Congratulated the Kearny Century Business Center for bringing in a fantastic business that is going to help the city; CCS California, one of the largest integrators of audio and visual equipment solutions in the United States. Commented that it is really nice to see how McDonald's had reinvested in the city with their new building which will be a nice improvement to the El Segundo Corridor. Is happy to see Hawthorne is working on getting a bike path. Received complaints from the Hollyglen area that curb painters are not following curb painting procedures. Inquired on the status of consolidating the permitting process.

Councilmember **Vargas** also received complaints from Hollyglen and Hollypark regarding curb painters and asked that we keep an eye on this situation so it doesn't get out of hand. With regards to the redistricting issue, the final maps will be approved August 15<sup>th</sup>. After that there are two options: gather 450,000 signatures in 90 days to be able to counter what the commission has done or a community group would have to get together and join a class action lawsuit. Congratulated the Ramona Homeowners Association for the Ramona picnic and the Hollypark Homeowners Association for National Night Out. Invited everyone to visit the new McDonald's on El Segundo which is on the forefront building design.

Mayor **Guidi** thanked the residents, community and Council that really pushed hard to keep Hawthorne as part of the South Bay Cities. Asked that we step up and clean up the crime-ridden area of Doty between El Segundo and 135<sup>th</sup> Street. Thanked McCormack Ambulance Service and the Los Angeles County Fire Department for the tributes on their vehicles to our fallen officer Andrew Garton. Announced that the 9/11 Ceremony will fall on a Sunday this year and will be held at City Hall. Clarified that an article in the LA Times stating that paying red light tickets is voluntary is only in the City of Los Angeles and does not apply to Hawthorne. Spoke on articles in the LA Times regarding Senators who spend our tax dollars on expensive cars.

City Clerk **Huber** reported on how sad it was to hear that 30 of our Navy Seals were shot down in Afghanistan this past week. Thanked everyone who helped with Good Neighbors Day. Recognized that former historian Walt Dixon's memorabilia was on display at Good Neighbors Day and recently in the lobby. The Historical Society is looking for a permanent location to display all of the historical records, photos and memorabilia that have been returned to the city. Attended an elections committee workshop at the County Clerk's office and came away with more confidence in the County as far as assessing the number of voters (32,000) in the city. Reminded all candidates that have pulled papers that the filing period ends August 12<sup>th</sup>. The City Clerks office will be open by appointment only if you are going to file on that day. If an incumbent does not run for their office, the filing period will be extended until August 17<sup>th</sup>. Toured Marco Fine Arts, located at the former Ken Cranes, which has moved from El Segundo to Hawthorne and is currently employing 30 people. Stated that the city is so much better because of the work that Code Enforcement does. Reported that it was nice to read in the paper on Sunday about entrepreneur Chet Pipkin who started out in Hawthorne.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** thanked Kyle Orleman for the work she did in bringing everyone together to work on the redistricting issue. Attended the McDonald's opening. Commended Hollypark and the



North Side homeowners on National Night Out. Spoke on what a special event Good Neighbors Day was.
