

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,  
CALIFORNIA HELD AUGUST 23, 2011.**

Mayor Guidi called the City Council, Community Redevelopment Agency, Parking Authority and Housing Authority meetings to order jointly and concurrently at 6:03 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 4455 W. 126<sup>th</sup> Street, Hawthorne, California.

Darlene Love gave the evening's invocation. Tom Quintana led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Works Director Arnie Shadbehr gave a presentation regarding Rosecrans Avenue Improvement Project. The project will be funded by grants such as HSIP grants and Measure R grants. It will reconstruct pavement structural sections on Rosecrans Avenue and widen Rosecrans Avenue westerly from the 405 Freeway off-ramp to add a new receiving westbound lane on Rosecrans Avenue.

The safety committee of the Hollypark Homeowners Association will present their disaster preparedness plan for Hollypark at their next meeting at Pacifica House on September 1<sup>st</sup> at 7pm. **Mauricio Crosthwaite**, President of Sociedad Jose Marti, invited everyone to attend their annual Cuban Festival on September 18<sup>th</sup> from 1pm to 7pm at 12141 Prairie Avenue. Admission is \$5. **Allen Richards** reported that there is an odor on the west side of Hawthorne Boulevard from 117<sup>th</sup> to Imperial. For businesses that don't clean the front of their establishments on Hawthorne Boulevard and on Inglewood Avenue, suggested that the city start steam cleaning those sidewalks and charging the owners for the service. There are also problems with apartment buildings that do not keep their properties clean. **Gordon Mego** spoke on upgrading the lights on Hawthorne Boulevard and other major streets in the city. **Marco Trejo** spoke on a neighboring business that is directly competing with and undercutting his business and asked that Council come up with a regulation or review that takes into consideration like businesses that are close together. **Trina Leon**, on behalf of New Journey Ministries Pastor John Richardson, would like to invite everyone to their Friends and Family Picnic at Jim Thorpe Park on September 11<sup>th</sup> at 1pm. **Nilo Michelin**, Hawthorne School Board, announced that Hawthorne Math and Science Academy will be open for students on August 24<sup>th</sup> and the rest of schools will open on August 30<sup>th</sup>. Wished Councilmember Lambert the very best in getting well and hopes to see her back on the Council. Stated that Mayor Guidi has done a fabulous job here in the city for the last 20 years and wished him the very best.

Councilmember **Vargas** congratulated the Mayor, all the Italian associations and Fiat for the event they put on at the new Fiat dealership. Thanked the Sheriff's department from Baldwin Park for putting on a special motorcycle ride from Baldwin Park to Long Beach. The ride is done every year in honor of a fallen police officer and this year it was done in honor of Andrew Garton. Attended the event at the Islamic Center and thanked them for their great food and hospitality. Congratulated Arnie Shadbehr and Mark Hardison on putting exercise equipment in the parks; the Parks and Recreation Foundation, Mark Ridley-Thomas and the Trust for Public Land are all contributing monies to this project.

Reported that a truck is going around Ramona at 9:10pm and that it is not your typical ice-cream truck.
