

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE

Offered the new councilmembers an opportunity to share any items through his newspaper column. Announced that Hawthorne Historical Society will meet next Wednesday at the Hawthorne library at 6pm; the public is welcome to attend. Reported that this year is the 50th anniversary of the Beach Boys and there has been some talk of doing something to commemorate this celebration.

Councilmember **Vargas** congratulated Arnie Shadbehr and his public works team for assembling a great grant proposal for the improvement of the Rosecrans Corridor. Congratulated the new Mayor and Councilmembers and stated that he is looking forward to working with the newly assembled Council. Hopes everybody had a great Christmas and New Year and looks forward to a positive future.

Councilmember **Valentine** thanked Jan Vogel and the staff of the SBWIB for the orientation session she attended on January 6th. The SBWIB serves nine cities providing a wide array of employment services. There will be a Youth Job Fair on March 29th at the Hawthorne Memorial Center for those aged 18 to 21. Thanked city employees, Moneta Gardens and the police department for their efforts in distributing toys at city hall. Had the honor of attending Prairie Vista South where Alex Monteiro and his organization held an event to give toys and boxes of food to needy families. Encouraged anyone who is interested, to apply for the open board seat of the Hawthorne School District. As a history teacher who has taught on the subject, was pleased to see tonight's resolution on Fred T. Korematsu Day. Attended an orientation on the South Bay Workforce Investment Board and thanked Executive Director Jan Vogel for everything he is doing. Thanked Arnie Shadbehrr for his work on the Rosecrans Improvement project and for obtaining grants on the project in-house. Feels the city should pursue more in-house grants. As a citizen who spoke against used car dealerships, thanked Council for approving the moratorium on tonight's agenda in order to take a better look at the situation. Requested a report regarding the density and other components for the project on the former Wild Goose site. Wished everyone a happy new year.

Councilmember **English** announced that the South Bay Cities Council of Governments will hold a breakfast and briefing with legislative district staff this coming Thursday from 8am to 9:30am and asked that someone from city staff be there if a Councilmember cannot attend. Announced that Supervisor Mark Ridlely Thomas will hold his 20th Annual Empowerment Congress at USC on January 14th. Commended Council's efforts in proclaiming January 30th as Fred T. Korematsu Day. Gave direction to forward a Certificate of Recognition be given in honor of Shen Yun 2012 this coming Saturday. Announced that she is supporting a great group of individuals known as Latino United Community and Higher Education Association (LUCHA) who will be holding a golf tournament on April 23rd to raise money that will go towards scholarships for college bound students. With regards to what will go on the Wild Goose property, feels it may be too late for public comment on the city's stance. The owner chose to sell the property so that housing could be developed and anybody who lives there will be part of society and attend local schools. Requested help in the clean up of Christmas trees that are still out there along the railroad tracks adjacent to Broadway and near York. Requested a report on the ordinance language for commercial vehicles that park at residences for working purposes. Would like to take a look at the parking issue regarding the medium on Hawthorne Boulevard. Wants a better understanding on the issue of beauty salons and nail facilities within the commercial zone and what that entails. Thanked all the organizations that assisted her in providing turkeys and toys to needy families, including 9/11 Help America and Alex Monteiro's. Would like to focus on keeping the Imperial Corridor clean in order to attract business and revenue from foot traffic that could be brought in due to the South Bay Green Line extension. Wished everyone a happy new year and thanked the audience for attending this first meeting of January.

Mayor **Juarez** spoke on how the city is not sitting down and allowing the dissolving of the Redevelopment Agency just go by. The city is taking action because we need to protect our assets. CDBG and HOME funds will be cut so it is going to be tough to see how we actually use those funds to get the greatest yield. Announced that the store that started off last year as Nathan's Hot Dogs ended up closing at the end of the year. Spoke on the changes regarding local businesses with Valero changing to Union 76 and Bally's changing to LA Fitness so at least there are other companies that are willing to stay here to make sure we have these services for the people of Hawthorne. Received notice of a mass layoff for a company that's on El Segundo Boulevard and also for Northrop so wants to make sure that people are aware that the WIB is available to help those who don't have jobs. Attended the ribbon cutting for the Rosecrans improvement project. Resources for this project came from four different entities, one of them being Congresswoman Maxine Waters who kicked in \$500,000. Received a letter from the South Bay Business Environmental Coalition congratulating city employee Doug Krauss. Doug was thanked for planning the 2011 So Cal Environmental Excellence Development Awards Program. For Mark Hardison, a letter for the tennis courts at Memorial Park. For Sgt. Chris Cognac and Det. John Dixon who attended a rental property owner's meeting and were instrumental in getting a lot of things done. In the South Bay Watch newsletter there was an article on the segways used by our police department which puts a nice light on our city. Reported that the solar panels at the memorial center that have been in existence since October 2010 have generated 316.94 megawatts. This saves about \$57,000 a year. While attending a Wiseburn Watch Homeowners Association meeting, it was revealed that another pathway like the one in Hollyglen will be built on the other side of the 405 freeway. Extended congratulations the new board of directors of the Hollypark Homeowners Association and thanked Olivia Valentine for all the work she did in getting this association up to an excellent level. Attended a Cerise Avenue Neighborhood Watch meeting where issues of dumping and drug selling were discussed so a meeting with the police chief will be set up in the near future. Was privileged and honored to be a part of Da Vinci High School Bill Hearing Night through the Westchester YMCA where a number of bills were dealt with by future leaders. The senior center hours are still being worked on. Wants to make sure that something is included about notifying the police department regarding the parking of motorhomes. Announced that the Hawthorne Police Department and the city will be holding the 6th Annual Battle of the Badges Blood Drive on
