Under oral communications Rev. **Teresa Santillana** of Hawthorne United Methodist Church, asked for continued support of LAX workers. **Maria Sanchez** spoke regarding tough working conditions at LAX and asked for continued support. **Lani Emmich**, Event Chair for Hawthorne Relay for Life, announced that there are currently 30 teams for Relay for Life. A donation of canned foods is being held to help out with the Iluminaria project; the canned goods will then be donated to the Hawthorne Presidents Council for their food distribution program. Paint the Town Purple, which brings awareness to Relay for Life, will be held on March 17<sup>th</sup>. **Don Rowe**, Hawthorne Library, announced that they have a new partnership with the Crenshaw Social Security office to create an iCenter at the library. **Dulce Stein**, Friends of the Hawthorne Library, spoke on programs supported by the Friends and announced that there will be a Book and Bake Sale on April 14<sup>th</sup>. She invited everyone to join Friends of the Library, which is \$5 for a lifetime membership. **Bryant Crook & Rafael Scott**, representing Holly Park Little League Baseball, invited Council to attend opening day on March 10<sup>th</sup>. Requested donations to help support little league baseball and announced that they would like to have a carnival to offset costs. **Patricia Donaldson**, President Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce, presented a plaque to new Chamber member International Auto Body. **Susan Hillyer**, representing the Hawthorne Del Air Certified Farmer's Market, thanked Council for the exposure she received at the last meeting as it increased the number of patrons to the market. #### Under Council’s Discussion/ Action Items

a.- Extension of Mixed-Use Overlay to include all of Imperial Highway between roughly Inglewood Avenue and near Yukon Avenue (English).

Due to the growth of LAX and the extension of the rail lines that will come through the 105 Imperial Corridor, Councilmember English feels the easterly and westerly portions of the Imperial Corridor should be developed so our city could benefit from it. Councilmember English would like to bring this back when the planning department has more information on the needs of this project and more information about the groups that are looking at this right now as far as what their visions for the future are. Councilmember Valentine asked that a look be taken at how we can restrict it in such a way that we would wind up with high quality development and lowest possible density as far as housing is concerned. Mayor Juarez would like to include how we are going to outreach to the public.

b.- Direct staff to prepare ordinance amendment for consideration before the Planning Commission that would allow check cashing activities when combined with a full service (bona fide) financial institution. (English)

Because Kinecta is a bona fide banking institution that provides services such as home loans, car loans, and savings accounts, they should be able to cash checks for non customers as other banks along Hawthorne Boulevard are allowed to do. This would also give Kinecta the opportunity to get non customers to open an account with them thereby also making use of their many services. Councilmember English directed staff to bring this request back to the planning commission so Kinecta can be given instructions on how to move forward with this request.

c.- Consider paperless alternative to providing agenda items to elected officials. City staff presently compiles bi-monthly agenda packets to Councilmembers using reams of paper. City resources should not be used to personally deliver city council packets to Councilmembers and City clerk staff should not have to spend hours making copies of city council packets for distribution. The city needs to conserve on the use of paper. Many cities are selecting the paperless alternative in receiving their council packets. The city is functioning on a skeletal crew in each department, and it is imperative that we use available resources on a more efficient basis. Many cities are now utilizing iPads as a preferred Environmental choice of distributing packets to Councilmembers. (English)

Councilmember English directed staff to research the cost of alternative methods in producing agenda packets and to see what other cities are doing.

c.- Amend RV ordinance re: procedure for contacting police department. (Mayor Juarez)

Mayor Juarez continues to get calls from residents whose RVs are being ticketed. We need to educate people so they understand that there is a procedure in place and amend our ordinance which right now does not say that they need to contact the police department.

d.- d.- More clarity in Hawthorne Municipal Code re: what is the definition of commercial vehicle (Mayor Juarez)

Mayor Juarez asked for a better definition of what a commercial vehicle is so that people who are using their personal vehicles, for example, to sell other products are not ticketed.

City Treasurer **Lubenec** feels the city does need to move forward and there has to be a plan. Every part of the city should be invested in so the residents can benefit.

City Clerk **Huber** thanked Mayor Juarez and Councilmember Valentine for attending the Hawthorne Historical Society meeting at Ramona a couple of weeks ago. Looking forward to possibly next meeting approving a possible lease of the police station with the Historical Society. Attended the grand opening of the French bakery on Inglewood and 136<sup>th</sup>. An official ribbon cutting ceremony for the bakery will held on Friday. Announced that tomorrow is Run for Life for Ronald McDonald House. For every mile you run, a dollar will be donated to Ronald McDonald House. The Hawthorne Parks and Recreation Foundation will hold their golf tournament on April 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Councilmember **Vargas** thanked the police department for their quick response and professionalism to the two major incidents in North Hawthorne and Moneta Gardens within the past couple of weeks. Participated in the Hawthorne Police department soccer tournament fundraiser where backpacks were collected for local school children in need. Requested a report on the dates and source of funding for new hires. Residents are concerned that a Walmart will be coming to the city, but staff has not received any inquiries on this subject. Asked that code enforcement address the issue of a commercial truck that continues to park on 120<sup>th</sup> and Eucalyptus and businesses along Hawthorne Boulevard that are putting items for sale on the sidewalk.

Councilmember **Valentine** encouraged the community to support Holly Park Little League. Congratulated Patricia Donaldson for being sworn in as the 2012 South Bay Association Chamber of Commerce Chair. Offered support for Relay for Life, an important event that brings the community together. One of the great announcements that occurred this month was the groundbreaking of the National Museum of African American History and Culture which will be located on the mall in Washington D.C. in 2015. Announced that the Teen Center will hold a Black History celebration at the Memorial Center tomorrow at 5pm. Thanked Animal Control Officer Evelyn Diaz and acknowledged Councilmember English for cosponsoring the Locks of Love event on Saturday at the Memorial Center. Announced that the 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Vietnam Veterans of America Scholarship Essay program for high school seniors is still soliciting applications for \$1000 scholarships; the deadline is April 9<sup>th</sup>.

Councilmember **Michelin** encouraged everyone to attend Relay for Life and the Illuminaria ceremony. Hopes everyone takes advantage of the Social Security information on the second and fourth Thursday of the month at the library. Encouraged supporting the Hawthorne Library and the book sale. Thanked Holly Park Little League and Susan Hillyer of the Farmers market for their presentations. Is glad that Officer Garton is being honored by designating part of the 405 freeway in his honor. Thanked the Reverend and the workers for their testimony regarding working conditions at LAX and to Council for passing the worker's resolution.

The Hawthorne Lions will honor Citizen of the Year, Victor Penzo, on March 6<sup>th</sup> at the Moose Lodge. California Edison will be offering a tour of their facilities at 5235 Marine Avenue on April 11<sup>th</sup>.
